THE MINISTER'S MESSAGE

For the five Sundays of September I want to do a series of lessons that pertain to the conversion experience, or what happens when you become a follower of Jesus Christ. Our Hymn of the Month begins with the line: "What a wonderful change in my heart has been wrought since Jesus came into my heart." And there are numerous texts in the New Testament that describe that experience. Jesus speaks of being born from above,



or born again. Paul and other writers speak of being brought back to life, saved, redeemed, sanctified, and even remade by God as a potter shapes a lump of clay. But all these terms and concepts describe essentially the same thing. They are about relationship with God, and with it commitment to live for God as opposed to living for self.

Now, we have to appreciate that many Christians were raised in church and in a tradition of faith. From early childhood they knew nothing else but believing in God and His Son Jesus Christ. Nineteenth century scholar Horace Bushnell taught that such is the way it should be. He spoke against a common belief in his day that children were born in sin and were excluded from matters of faith until they reached the age of accountability (presumably twelve). So, ideally, Bushnell taught, a child should be part of the church family from birth and never know anything accept living in devotion to God.

However, it seems that even Christians who have been raised in faith still experience some kind of spiritual epiphany when they realized fully its meaning. It might be a quiet and subtle moment like Samuel hearing God calling in the night. Others might experience some very hard times in life, and then come to an awareness of waywardness and wrong-doing. Whatever the circumstances, the concept of conversion represents a turning point, a change in perception and direction, a time of renewal and redirection. Among Disciples of Christ, that is when a child chooses to be baptized, "putting on Christ" symbolically and willfully turning away from the temptations of the world. The concepts we are about to explore represent, in various ways, a change in heart, mind, and spirit—from lost to found, from sinner to saint, from a child of the world to a child of God. I hope these lessons will enthuse, inform, and inspire. Gloria will be away all five weeks of September, and her magic fingers on the piano will be missed. But our friend Barbara Emmons will substitute three of those Sundays, and Brad will be there to lead. We also have special music planned, and our Adult Sunday School class will resume September 1. So, I look forward to seeing you in Sensational September.

HYMN OF THE MONTH - "SINCE JESUS CAME INTO MY HEART"

Since Jesus Came into my Heart was written by Rufus Henry McDaniel. McDaniel was born in 1850 in Ohio. By the age of nineteen he was already preaching and eventually became a minister of the Disciples of Christ Church in 1873.

McDaniel wrote, "I feel in my soul that God has something for me to do in brightening the experience of struggling souls. My chief desire is to be a blessing, if possible, to my fellow-men through these hymns and thereby glorify God in the name of his dear son 'whose I am and whom I serve.'"

He and his wife Margaret Dragoo had three children, but their youngest son, Herschel, died in early 1913. After the untimely death of his son, McDaniel sat down and wrote the words as a reminder of maintaining joy, faith and hope in times of trial. He felt there was no better way to honor his son than to write music about his faith.

He sent this poem and five other poems to Charles Hutchinson Gabriel, but when he never heard anything, so he figured his poems had been rejects. He then began to read of the words to his poem in various publications. Not only did Gabriel take one of his poems and put it to music, it was in fact sung at most of those revival meetings with Billy Sunday crusades in 1915. The song became so popular that people began to sing the song in the streets of Philadelphia.

It is reported that during these crusades God used the lyrics of the song to convert an Officer Fowler of the Philadelphia Police Department. The officer convinced many of his officers to attend the services and more than a hundred professed their faith in Christ.

McDaniel served a number of churches in Ohio, before retiring in Dayton, Ohio. He died on February 13, 1940, having written over 100 hymns over his lifetime.


