

WHAT IS SSD (SOCIAL SQUARE DANCING)?

The Student Stomp is back at the SSD Class Level. This dance is specifically for Rail Dusters and students from other clubs to have the experience of a fun square dance and to dance to different callers. The dance is supported by Trail Dusters and all the other clubs in our ASquareD area. All the callers from the various clubs will be calling the calls taught up to the time of the dance and will include line dancing. Note: there is Rotation Board which unaccompanied dancers into a square. So if you don't have a partner, we'll get you one. So C'MON OUT for the Student Stomp! That means all you Rail Dusters and all Trail Dusters who can come out as angels to support our students. (The details of the 2024 dance are in the flyer on page 15).

This used to be called a "Half-Way" Dance. "Half-Way" to where? And how does SSD fit in? Well, way back in the previous 50 years or so, most of the square dance clubs in Southern California taught 105 or so square dance calls in a period of 35 weeks. The students learned all calls from the beginning level, "Basic," through the next level, "Mainstream" and on to "Plus."

When the students had learned half of these calls, Trail Dusters and the other area clubs jointly held a dance for the students that became known as the Halfway Dance. After this dance, the students learned the other half of the calls. The problem was that there just wasn't enough time to practice all of the complex "plus" calls crammed into the last few weeks, and most Rail Dusters (and students at other clubs, too) looked like survivors of some epic train wreck.

After graduation, many of us went to square dances at the Plus level with some anxiety and lots of frustration, which caused many to quit.

Then something positive happened. Snow birds in Texas were interested in learning square dancing. With a limited amount of time, there was no way they could learn all 105 Plus level calls, so callers in the Rio Grande Callers Association came up with a program to instruct dancers in 12 weeks by including nearly all Basic calls and part of the "Mainstream" calls. And so, Social Square Dancing, or SSD, was born and has become a national movement which our ASquareD district and Trail Dusters have adopted. We think the SSD approach is working well for Trail Dusters with so many of last years' students returning and bringing their friends to join our newest class.

So "pleeze", members and Rail Dusters keep coming to classes and the Student Stomp in January.


