THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

11th - 12th January 2020, Year A

You are my beloved Son

Today's celebration marks the end of the Christmas season and the beginning of Ordinary Time. The Baptism of the Lord in the Synoptic Gospels marks a swift transition from Jesus' infancy and childhood, to his adult public ministry.

The Baptism story that we hear today, in Matthew's Gospel, is an initiation story. Matthew introduces Jesus as God's long awaited Chosen One on whom God's Spirit rests. We hear it against the backdrop of the first reading from Isaiah. The voice of God commissions the chosen one to bring forth justice, sensitively and without fanfare: to be a light to the peoples; to open the eyes of the blind and set captives free. It is God's will that He fulfil his messianic role, not through the exercise of power and domination in the conventional way of rulers throughout the world, but through solidarity with the sinful, suffering and burdened mass of humanity and to establish true justice by quiet, gentle, but persevering encouragement of those who are crushed and downtrodden.

And so our Gospel today is telling us: 'Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to be baptised by John.' He was baptised, not because he needed a baptism of repentance for himself, but in order to identify with and reach out to those who did. It then happened that God, whom Jesus would always call 'My Father' and 'Our Father' during his ministry, spoke to him so there could be no mistake about his identity before



God: "You are my beloved Son, my chosen one."

In effect, the message Jesus was hearing from God at his baptism was this: "Go to my people. Tell them that I love them. Show them that I love them. Gather them together and bring them back to me". There and then Jesus understood the whole future direction of his life and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and proclaiming God's love for all.

We are all deeply loved by God and are his sons and daughters made so by baptism. We are also brothers and sisters of Jesus. By our baptism we have been joined to his person, and share in his life and mission. As we celebrate his baptism let us re-open our hearts to the Father's call: Go to my people. Tell them and show them that I love them. Gather them together and bring them back to me.

The Baptism of the Lord - Year A 11th - 12th January 2020

The First Reading: Isaiah 42:1-4. 6-7

Here is my servant, my chosen one in whom I am well pleased. Thus says the Lord: Here is my servant whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom my soul delights. I have endowed him with my spirit that he may bring true justice to the nations. He does not cry out or shout aloud, or make his voice heard in the streets. He does not break the crushed reed, nor quench the wavering flame. Faithfully he brings true justice; he will neither waiver, nor be crushed until true justice is established on earth, for the islands are awaiting his law. I, the Lord, have called you to serve the cause of right; I have taken you by the hand and formed you; I have appointed you as covenant of the people and light of the nations, to open the eyes of the blind, to free captives from prison, and those who live in darkness from the dungeon.

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 28:1-4, 9-10. R. v.11 **R**/ The Lord will bless his people with peace.

The Second Reading: Acts 10:34-38

God anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power.

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'The truth I have now come to realise' he said, 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.' 'It is true, God sent his word to the people of Israel, and it was to them that the good news of peace was brought by Jesus Christ – but Jesus Christ is Lord of all men. You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil.'

Gospel Acclamation: see Mk 9:8

Alleluia! The heavens were opened and the Father's voice was heard: this is my beloved Son, hear him. **Alleluia!**

Gospel: Matthew 3:13-17

When Jesus was baptised, the heavens were opened and the Spirit of God came upon him.

Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to be baptised by John. John tried to dissuade him. 'It is I who need baptism from you,' he said 'and yet you come to me!' But Jesus replied, 'Leave it like this for the time being; it is fitting that we should, in this way, do all that righteousness demands.' At this, John gave in to him. As soon as Jesus was baptised he came up from the water, and suddenly the heavens opened and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming down on him. And a voice spoke from heaven, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on him.'
