THE MUSEUM OF IDEAS

A WRITING SEMINAR FOR VISUAL THINKERS, AGES 10-16

Small groups of 3-5 students will collaborate on a creative and possibly hilarious project to build their own miniature museum. The subject is determined by the students' interests: The Academy of Monsters; The Dream Archive; The Hall of Primitive Technology....? The seminar includes a walking field trip to the East Bay Depot for Creative Reuse, where we gather supplies.

The hands-on experience of planning and building displays is designed to help students understand the thought processes behind analyzing, organizing and presenting information. This is a unique opportunity for kids who aren't comfortable with writing--or who love storytelling but could use a little more structure—to learn new strategies based on visual, verbal, and physical interaction with their material.
