About the Work

Dedicated to Alan Zabriskie and the Texas Tech University Choir, the work sets a small fragment of the poem *The Divine Pilgrim* by Conrad Aiken. The theme of love, both in the now and in the remembrances of long ago establish a sense of imagery that was part of the discussion about writing the work and the thematic idea of the concert on which it would premiere. I had used Aiken's poetry before and loved his use of imagery and musical metaphor. The fragment here takes on a life of its own apart from the larger poem and fits beautifully in what I was looking for in a text about the aspect of lost love and found love. The depths of emotion within a choir setting are explored throughout, with melody and harmonic color equally designed into the music. Contrapuntal and chordal settings are interspersed creating an everchanging sense of choral flow leading to the exclamation point on the last line. The work is set for unaccompanied SATB *divisi* choir.
