FEATHERS IN THE WIND

I have maintained for a long long time that nurses are the unsung heros/heroines of the medical profession. They are the ones who are willing to listen, to comfort you, to find the vein that no one else can, wipe the mess up and hold your hand when things look hopeless.

Speaking from experience I always relax more when I see a nurse come in to the room.

At the University of Iowa Hospital they send you out questionnaires asking if we would like to nominate a nurse for superior service. I wish I could remember all names of the nurses I had and nominate them because somehow they kept me "going" and even laughing.

There was the one nurse who tried to help me get my wedding ring off. It took forever until she finally went into a tool drawer and cut it off (the ring, not the finger).

A little while later I was on the operating table and someone was about to put a mask over my mouth and nose. I grabbed this man's hand and asked. Do you believe in God?"

It really startled him, but he did answer me so I told him to start praying and he could go on.

The next batch of nurses were in the urology department. I thought that strange since I could not think what that particular department had to do with the procedure I had gone through. The two nurses and I started making jokes that people wondered what was going on.

The second surgery I had a nurse who wore a tiny doll around her neck to help new mothers realize how babies need very little milk in the beginning. She was concerned over my bleeding and would take her "time off" periods to look and talk to others about what to do to help me.

Being a fussy eater I couldn't eat, however one Friday I ordered fish. Suddenly I got so sick my nurse rushed out to find something to stop the nausea. She finally ended up finding some hard candy for me to suck on. It worked!

I actually was afraid to leave the hospital. Well, I did have to return for chemo. They brought stuff to drink or make you comfortable. Even if you got sick a nurse would come with scrubs and help clean you up. Sometimes you wanted to lay on the floor and expire, but there was always a nurse that got you up again.

It is years later and I have to deal with Sara's nurse and my sleep study at our clinic. This woman is remarkable. I've had to take two tests and then, when the results came back, I was told I had to return for yet another test.

That was too much for me! I told her that at the sleep center Charlemagne had gone with me. We had BOTH told them! had worn a CPAP for years - decades even. We even brought it along, but obviously they hadn't listened.

We also explained (more then once) that the place where we had been buying the masks, filters, and hose had said we had to get a new machine. No one listened.

MY AMANA EXPERIENCE

I've begun helping with shipping mail order packages at the Woolen Mill, which I enjoy very much as I like to imagine the happy reaction of the recipients and the places to which these gifts travel. We sent a most interesting box a couple weeks ago that really piqued my interest. It went to a military base overseas ... somewhere. The address itself provided no information exactly where the package would end its journey, except that its final destination was a military base across the Atlantic.

I went directly to Charisse Lawrence, Amana Society Director of E-commerce & Direct Mail for answers, and she did not disappoint. Charisse told me that every Amana Society business will at least occasionally send out mail orders, but of course the Big Daddy of shipping packages is the Amana Meat Shop & Smokehouse. I may have added Big Daddy. Charisse probably did not say that exactly.

I want to start with the most staggering statistic, because you may need a moment to mentally digest this fact. I know I did: The Meat Shop shipped 52,575 orders last year. Not items, orders. Those packages went to every state in the United States, with the majority shipping to Iowa, Illinois, Minnesota, Missouri, and Wisconsin. The "snowbird states" of California, Florida, Texas, and Arizona are not far behind, as lowans will not go without their delicious Amana goodies. I for one cannot blame them. The Meat Shop will only occasionally ship to Puerto Rico, Canada, and overseas military bases, due to the high costs of shipping and perishable nature of the goods.

The highest numbers for sales volume in mail order for the Meat Shop were, not surprisingly, 2020 and 2021. Charisse tells me that the 2022 numbers were still way above pre-pandemic sales, and she expects them to stay that way. Repeat business is always high due to the tradition of sending holiday gift packages, dating back to the first Amana Society, Inc. print catalogs which began in the 1960s.

So this holiday season while you're enjoying your delicious Amana ham, you might think for a moment of so many others across the country (or maybe across the world) enjoying theirs as well. And you might feel kind of proud of our Amana products. I think you should.
