Meeting called to order at 6:01 pm

Members reminded to silence phones & no talking during the meeting unless recognized.

Members reminded to observe two-minute time limit for comments/questions

Moment of silence in remembrance of Mike Giordano.

Clearview Management report given by Stacy K.; roofs completed, mason work continues, fence painting begins in September, some fences are being repaired at this time. Wood repairs ongoing, still working on updating member info, which is important. Orientation for new members only, will be in October. Report approved.

Financial report given and approved; report is posted in newsletter monthly. The tax bills have been sent out. If you haven't received a tax bill please contact Clearview, you don't want to be late. June minutes approved.

The 2023 Fiscal Audit of Colonial Acres Phase V is available for review, contact Clearview to review. App folio will be available sometime in September. It will have repair request forms and tracking of repair request will be able to be viewed, members will be informed when available.

#### **Old Business**

- \*Much discussion about placement of new park bench, perhaps the corner of Lexington and Ticonderoga??
- \*Bonnie Charles would like to pay for a park bench in honor of her husband Bill Charles, she will speak to the office about where to get them. Kelly will talk to her after the meeting.
- \*Discussion about taking up a collection for a bench for Mike Giordano.
- \*Gloria will work on the plaques that need to be ordered and placed on the benches.
- \*The present bench has been put in the garage by Paul T.
- \*Where would you like to see another bench placed? Judy K. suggested across from building 76 It's a nice grassy area & a no parking area & should help keep some of the cars off the grass.
- \*76 -2- behind her unit is another dilapidated bench that needs to be removed. Eventually there will be three benches, one we already own and two that we need to purchase. Locations to be decided.
- \*141-5 weeds need to be sprayed again. Kelly states we will put it in the 2025 budget.
- \*Election-three resumes have been received- George Birchmeier, Gary Williams, and Judy Stevens. Please vote, follow the directions otherwise your vote will not count.
- \*Zoom meeting-had responses from 15 people interested in zoom meetings. All of those people will need to have a smartphone and/or a computer and will need to talk to Stacy about getting that set up.
- \*Catch basins-Two completed and we have identified three more to be done.
- \*Road repairs have been done for the summer. We only patched this year. We did not do any major asphalt due to roof repairs needing to be done.
- \*76-3-I need my sunroom roof repaired or redone do we go through the roof company? Yes, when they are on site with all their equipment and extra shingles they will give you a discounted price.

- \*72-4-Heritage down Lexington can you put cold patch on the list for next year. It will be evaluated.
- \*Pool will be closing on September 13<sup>th</sup>, September 12th will be the last day to swim.

#### **New Business**

- \*There is an ordinance in the city of South Lyon that grills must be at least 10 ft away from the building. Fire pits are not allowed in the courtyard, fire pits need to be at least 30 ft from the building with a fire extinguisher and/or hose that will reach the area. No wood burning in your courtyard ever!!
- \*Trees on heritage were just trimmed.
- \*82-4-LJ will be the new newsletter editor, Laura Gola to proofread.
- \*Should we paint in front of the stop signs "STOP" to prevent the rolling stop? Decided No.
- \*65-1-the newsletter no longer contains the addresses of the units that have been pending or have sold. That is public knowledge, and you can get that off the internet. It is to stop the unwanted contact of new members.
- \*New member orientation will be in October; new members will be invited by mail.
- \*80-5-gutters on bus stops are facing out, worried about dripping and ice over the winter. Kelly's response, gutters are not on bus stops unless put on by a member.
- \*Bill Aldinger has replied that South Lyon gutters used to offer a good price on gutters if you're interested in adding gutters to your bus stop.
- \*There is a trip hazard on the sidewalk leaving the clubhouse toward the parking lot. Gloria suggested it be painted with a yellow caution line. Kelly said Paul can take care of that.
- \*Question about satellite dishes left behind buildings 108 & 92. Yorktown has satellite dish, are all on the ground, who is responsible? Once you're not using that service, dish satellite, DirecTV, and you've moved on they do not come back and remove the satellite dishes. It's your responsibility to remove them. You can put them in the trash, waste management will take them.
- \*Question by Gary Kibler 107-4- who's responsible for the gutters on the vinyl building? The original vinyl buildings the gutters are the responsibility of the member until replaced then they become the associations responsibility.
- \*Laura Gola-our gutters were cleaned out by Jamie and they work great. Who paid? The association because your building siding was replaced.
- \*107-4-why do we pay for the siding and not get service. The siding was put on every building in Phase V as a long-term investment. We would have paid 5 to 10 times more for wood by now if we had not replaced the wood buildings with vinyl, and that cost would have been shared by all of phase 5.
- \*Laura Gola will meet with Gloria from the board with her many questions about clubhouse responsibilities versus association responsibilities.
- 95-4-sidewalks crumbling. Kelly responded concrete & painting work will start in the fall. Meeting adjourned at 7:20 p.m.

# Musings.....

Every Drop Counts Denise Semion

Is our water free? Since none of us has to personally pay for our water bills, you might think it doesn't matter how much water you use. But, if you think about it, we all pay for our water in our monthly fees. And if you go to the Board Meetings or read the minutes in the newsletter, you will be aware that our water costs have increased and continue to increase.

The EPA has lots of tips on how to save water on their website <a href="https://www.epa.gov/watersense/about-watersense">https://www.epa.gov/watersense/about-watersense</a>. They recommend purchasing fixtures like showerheads and faucets with the "WaterSense" label for water efficiency.

Another thing that you can do is to check your plumbing fixtures for leaks. The average household's leaks can account for more than 10,000 gallons of water wasted every year, or the amount of water needed to wash 270 loads of laundry or wash 370 average-sized cars. According to the EPA, 10 percent of homes have leaks that waste 90 gallons or more per day. That means for our community, there could be as many as 50 units wasting 4,500 gallons of water a day. Common types of leaks are worn toilet flappers, dripping faucets and other leaking valves. These types of leaks are often easy to fix, requiring only a few dollars, tools and hardware.

You can identify toilet leaks by placing a drop of food coloring in the toilet tank. If any color shows up in the bowl after 10 minutes, you have a leak. (Flush immediately after the experiment to avoid staining the tank.) Check your faucet gaskets and pipe fittings for surface leaks.

Beyond checking your plumbing, if it's important to you to conserve water, (and I hope it is), you might want to think about how much water you use, and where you can save water resources. On average, American families use more than 300 gallons of water per day at home, and about 70 percent of this use occurs inside your home. More than half of all indoor water use is in the bathroom. There are some easy ways to save water: turn off the tap while brushing your teeth or shaving. Showers use less water than baths.

Tips for the kitchen include plugging your sink or using a dish basin when hand washing dishes, and only running the dishwasher when it's fully loaded. Using a dishwasher is almost always more efficient than washing your dishes by hand. Scrape plates instead of rinsing before loading into the dishwasher. A pitcher of drinking water stored in your refrigerator provides instant cold water instead of running the faucet until the water is cool.

Thaw frozen food in your refrigerator overnight rather than running water over the food. In your laundry room, wash only full loads of laundry or be mindful of the correct water level for the size of your wash load. If you wash your car, use a hand-held nozzle that turns off when not in use.

If you are like me, you want to avoid more monthly increases, and saving water is an important way we can all help reduce expenses.


