HISTORIAN'S CORNER

JAPANESE SURRENDER REVISITED

Did you ever wonder why the United States chose a battleship as the location for Japan's surrender in World War 2, even though they were in Tokyo Bay?

Nothing says "you're defeated" more than having to sign the surrender documents on the enemy's battleship in the home waters of your capital city.

Why the USS Missouri?

President Truman insisted on the USS Missouri because Missouri was his home state. The Navy had planned on using the USS South Dakota.

Symbolism of the ships location

The ship was anchored at the precise latitude/longitude recorded in Commodore Perry's log during his 1845 visit, symbolizing the purpose of both visits to open Japan to the west. Perry's original flag was also present, having been flown all the way from the Naval Academy for the ceremony. *Side Boys (?)*

For those not familiar with this, Side Boys are an honor guard of sailors that are placed at the top of the ladder way when dignitaries come aboard. For the surrender ceremony, sailors over six feet tall were used, a further intimidation of the short statured Japanese.

Lastly, after the signing ceremony, as the Japanese delegation were leaving the Missouri, an armada of over 400 planes flew over Tokyo Bay, reminding the Japanese should they have second thoughts on their surrender.

Marine Ethan Bartley graduated from Mt.Clemens High School in 2008, joined the Marine Corps and went off to boot camp in October 2008. Then he went on to MCT (Marine Combat Training) in North Carolina and next to 29 Palms California for COMMS school.

His first unit was in Camp Pendleton 2nd Battalion 1st Marines on Camp Horno. As soon as hearrived there he started a Work up to deploy to Afghanistan the following year in 2010. In 2011 he returned to Camp Pendleton and then immediately started another Work up, this time for the 31ST MEU (Marine Expeditionary Unit) where the Marines provided training for multiple countries within the Pacific.

Ethan is nowback and forth between active duty Marine Corps and Reserves, working with robotics to assist with EOD (Explosive Ordinance Disposal) units and Combat engineers.
