MASS READING  
REFLECTION

Feb. 28, 2021  
First Reading  
Gn 22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18  
[Testing of Abraham]

In Hebrew tradition, Abraham represents the classic example of faith. This tradition describes an honest man, how he goes through a tormenting experience of uncertainty, and how he finally resolves it. Guided by God, the author brings out a timeless message to all who wrestle with the problem of fidelity, faith and trust in a future. He teaches that there is a way out if we dare to persevere, hoping against all hope, and in faith get on our knees to pray. “I believed, even when I said, ‘I am greatly afflicted’”(Responsorial Psalm). This could well have been said by Abraham!

How do we stand fast when shadows of uncertainty and doubt are tormenting us? We cold pray to God the Father to restore our vision and help us to look to his Son who calls us to repent and change the hardness of our hearts.

Rom 8:31b-34  
[God Is for Us]

“If God is for us, who can be against us?” This one line states in a nutshell what the other two reading reach in story form. Abraham experienced it when he was faithful in the darkest moment of is life (First Reading). The three apostles felt it when, in their doubt and embarrassment about the necessity of suffering in life, they enjoyed a moment of light and glory on the mountain (Gospel).

We, Gods chosen ones, should find consolation and courage in these words when we pass through the valley of darkness, doubt, and mental suffering.

Second Sunday of Lent

THEME: “If God Is for Us, Who Can Be Against Us?”

A Time of obscurity in our lives can constitute a more severe mental pain than any physical suffering. It may be a time of doubt about values that we have cherished as sacred in the past, fidelity in a stale marriage situation, commitment to religion in a parish setting that does not excite us, or dedication to a job under changed circumstances and with all other avenues closed. In each case, we do know where to turn.

Young people have problems with their faith. In their process of maturation they question all values, religion included, till they find themselves. More serious is the obscure situation grown-ups may go through.

We think of the professionals who work daily with test tubes, statistics, and computer results. They must know exactly what is going on. But this kind of one-sided pragmatism does not work in the field of interpersonal relations. How can we keep values like love and faith alive even when they are tempted by obscurity, confusion, and doubt? To-day’s Liturgy deals with this problem. Prayerful reading and listening may shed some light on it!
