Transfiguration of Jesus



... And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased." Luke 3:22

The word "transfiguration" comes from the Latin roots trans- ("across") and figura ("form, shape"). It thus signifies a change of form or appearance. This is what happened to Jesus in the event known as the Transfiguration: His appearance changed and became glorious. Before looking at the Transfiguration itself, it's important that we look at what happened immediately before it in Luke's Gospel.

The Transfiguration of Jesus is an episode in the New Testament in which Jesus is transfigured and becomes radiant in glory upon a mountain. The Synoptic Gospels (Matthew 17:1–9, Mark 9:2–8, Luke 9:28–36) describe it.

Jesus is the hope of the ages

In these accounts, Jesus

and three of his apostles, Peter, James and John, go to a mountain to pray. On the mountain, Jesus begins to shine with bright rays of light. Then the prophets Moses and Elijah appear next to him and he speaks with them. Jesus is then called "Son" by a voice in the sky, by God the Father, as in the Baptism of Jesus.

In Jesus' transfiguration, we are assured that Jesus is the hope of the ages. Jesus is the One who fulfilled the Law given through Moses, the one dreamed of by the prophets, of whom Elijah is the greatest.

In celebrating this event, we rejoice in the divine majesty of Christ, whose glory shone even when confronted with the cross. It is given us for our journey through Lent toward the agony of the cross and the victory of the empty tomb. We celebrate this mystery in order that our faith may be renewed. We are transformed into the new being in Christ as we join Christ in his death and resurrection in Lent and Easter.

Black History Month 2022 Theme "Black Health and Wellness"

Since 1976, every American president has designated February as Black History Month and endorsed a specific theme.

The Black History Month 2022 theme, "Black Health and Wellness," explores "the legacy of not only Black scholars and medical practitioners in Western medicine, but also other ways of knowing (e.g., birthworkers, doulas, midwives, naturopaths, herbalists, etc.) throughout the African Diaspora. The 2022 theme considers activities, rituals and initiatives that Black communities have done to be well."



Black History Month

The first black birth on record in what would become the U.S. happened in St. Augustine, Florida, in 1606. And the first African-American birth occurred in 1624, according to the African American Registry. One out of every four cowboys in the 1800s was black, CNN reported. Now there are more than 45 million African-Americans living in the U.S., according to Census Bureau data. That's about 15 percent of the nation's population. In 2013, New York had the most African-American residents, with 3.7 million.

Black History Month in February, also known as African-American History Month in America, is an annual observance in the United States, also Canada and the United Kingdom (in October) for remembrance of important people and events in the history of the African diaspora.

The precursor to Black History Month was created in 1926 in the United States, when historian Carter G. Woodson and the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History announced the second week of February to be "Negro History Week." This week was chosen because it coincided with the birthday of Abraham Lincoln on February 12 and of Frederick Douglass on February 14, both of which dates Black communities had celebrated together since the late 19th century. The expansion of Black History Week to Black History Month

was first proposed by the leaders of the Black United Students at Kent State University in February 1969. The first celebration of the Black History Month took place at Kent State one year later, in February 1970.

The month of February in Ohio is designated as "Black History Month" to honor and recognize the contributions that African Americans have made in the history of this state and the United States. (5.2244 Black history month. Effective Date: 2008 SB243 04-07-2009)

Interesting facts about Black History: the first black U.S. senator was Hiram Revels in 1870. The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People was founded in 1909. The first black NBA plaver was Earl Llovd in 1950. He played for the Washington Capitols and was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame more than half a century later, in 2003. African-Americans were responsible for the invention of 3D graphics, blood banks, gas masks, potato chips and Super Soaker water guns, according to HowStuffWorks and the Atlanta Black Star. Barack Hussein Obama II (born August 4, 1961) is an American politician who served as the 44th President of the United States. He was the first African American to hold the office. as well as the first president born outside of the continental United States.

Presidents' day

February 21st



Presidents' Day is a federal holiday celebrated on the third Monday in February; Presidents' Day 2022 will occur on Monday, February 21. Originally established in 1885 in recognition of President George Washington, the holiday became popularly known as Presidents' Day after it was moved as part of 1971's Uniform Monday Holiday Act, an attempt to create more three-day weekends for the nation's workers. While several states still have individual holidays honoring the birthdays of Washington, Abraham Lincoln and other figures, Presidents' Day is now popularly viewed as a day to celebrate all U.S. presidents, past and present.

The Uniform Monday Holiday Act also included a provision to combine the celebration of Washington's birthday with that of Abraham Lincoln, which fell on February 12. Lincoln's Birthday had long been a state holiday in places like Illinois, and many supported joining the two days as a way of giving equal recognition to two of America's most famous statesmen.

The shift from Washington's Birthday to Presidents' Day began in the late 1960s. While some argued that shifting holidays from their original dates would cheapen their meaning, the bill also had widespread support from both the private sector and labor unions and was seen as a surefire way to bolster retail sales.

Nevertheless, the main piece of the Uniform Monday Holiday Act passed in 1968 and officially took effect in 1971 following an executive order from President Richard M. Nixon. Washington's Birthday was then shifted from the fixed date of February 22 to the third Monday of February.

The practice of congregational polity dictates that the business of our congregation take place at annual congregational meetings. At these meetings, we do the following:


- Hear reports from the minister or ministers, staff, officers and committee chairs.

Parents, please read this to your younger child(ren)

On the Mountain Top with Jesus

Theme: The Transfiguration of Christ

Object: You might bring some skis, a sled, or some other item to represent the Olympics.

Scripture: After six days Jesus took with him Peter, James and John the brother of James, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. There he was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and his clothes became as white as the light. Just then there appeared before them Moses and Elijah, talking with Jesus. Matthew 17:1-3 (NIV)

How many of you watched the Winter Olympics on TV? Like many of you, I was caught up in the excitement of watching athletes from all over the world head for the snow-covered mountains of Russia to participate in the Winter Olympics. It was thrilling to watch them flying down the mountain on bobsleds, snowboards, and skis! Equally exciting was seeing the skaters spinning, jumping, dancing, and racing on the ice. Even if you aren't a big sports fan, you can share the excitement that the athletes feel as they represent their country and compete for a medal that proves that they are among the best in the world in their event.

Have you ever had an experience that was so wonderful that you didn't want to see it come to an end? I am sure that most of the athletes felt that way about seeing the Olympics come to an end. After all, they worked for four years to make it to the Olympics and they wanted to enjoy the feeling as long as possible. And yet, it seems that it was over all too soon.


The thrill of an life-changing event and a feeling of sadness at seeing it come to an end is what some of Jesus' disciples felt in today's Bible lesson. It is the story of an unforgettable experience on the mountain top with Jesus.

The story begins with Jesus taking three of his disciples, Peter, James, and John up onto a mountain to pray. As Jesus was praying, an amazing thing happened. The Bible says that the appearance of his face began to change and that his clothing became as bright as a flash of lightning. Next, Moses and Elijah appeared with Jesus. When Peter saw this, he was so excited that he told Jesus that he thought that they should just stay up there on the mountain and build three tabernacles—one for Jesus, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.

Peter didn't want this wonderful experience on the mountain to end. But what Peter didn't understand that it was necessary for this experience end in order that they might move forward to God's greatest gift to the world—the gift of salvation. Following this moment on the mountain, Jesus was crucified on the cross, was buried, and rose from the grave so that you and I could have eternal life in heaven.

God sends a lot of happy days into our life. The day that we decide to follow Jesus and make him our Lord and Savior is, no doubt, the happiest day of our life, but there are many more happy days to follow. When Jesus comes into our heart, it is the beginning of a life of joyfully serving him.

Dear Father, we thank you for all of the joyful experiences you send our way. Help us to grow in our daily walk with you. In Jesus' name we pray, amen.
