

Pastor's Paragraphs

"THE OLD/NEW NORMAL"

Well, when I "signed on" to serve as the Interim Pastor at Puckety, I never imagined that we would encounter together an entirely new scenario in the ways we live out being the Church. Together, we have ventured down this path in the power and presence of our God and we will continue to do exercising faith in our God, yet not seeking to tempt God either. So, as the Pastor and the Session, we covet your prayers. During this period, you have probably noticed the number of new "terms" that have come into common usage during these unusual times. They become part of our shared vocabulary and our shared experience even though we may not be in contact through physical presence and collective events. Only a few of these include:

- Flattening the Curve
- Contract Tracing
- Social distancing
- Community spread

Yet, my "favorite" among all of these and more is the phrase, the "new normal." A common assumption about this phrase is that there was a consistent way(s) of experiencing life (and church). Based upon our own personal experience, that might have

been the case, but was hardly true in the Church in previous generations or around the world (it is another way of saying that I am accustomed to this way, so that is the way it is going to be). So, while the surrounding environment may have changed dramatically around us, we allowed ourselves to be undeterred in our own practices and means. Then, along comes a pandemic. No longer immune from external realities nor able to ignore them, we have had to adjust and adapt to fulfill our core mission of who we are as the Church.

One of the key opportunities (yes, I said opportunities) of this change "forced" upon us in not only discovering new means of doing "old" things like distributing worship (Zoom, Facebook, YouTube, etc.), BUT also (hopefully) discerning, and using tools to BE the Church in fulfillment of our purpose and priorities. In fact, sometimes "subtraction" (removal) permits us to refocus. As a congregation, we have had the opportunity to intentionally connect with each other (not just rely on Sunday mornings) with Elders and Deacons leading the way (moving beyond just doing the "business" or programming of the church) but engaging in actual shepherding and compassion. No longer being able to rely upon the existing programs as proxies of fulfilling these roles, our congregational leadership have "stepped up."

Consequently, as we consider this "new normal," I am encouraged that we might retain these practices going forward and that we would not easily return to the "normal" as we knew it. The reality is that this "new normal" (although using different means) appears to be a lot more like the "old normal" (some would say in the Book of Acts and elsewhere) based upon the "norms" of God's revelation in bringing the good news in congregations and moving forward. So, this Old/New Normal may just bring us back to Being the Church (albeit through new means). Blessings,

GOING FORWARD

As a Session, we have begun plans for what it might look like when some restrictions are lifted. You may be aware that the Governor has provided some benchmarks on a possible phased-in reopening based upon counties and regions. This system uses the familiar "red"(which we are in currently across the state), "yellow" (which might be implemented in particular counties after May 8) and "green" (which might

be greater opening, but still with mitigation). It is possible that in the near future, we might move to a "yellow" phase which will permit group gathering <u>limited to twenty-five</u> and still require physical distancing. We will keep you posted as we go forward as Puckety Church community.

Hello from Pine Springs Camp!

We hope that this letter finds you and your family well and weathering the COVID- 19 pandemic better than you imagined. It is a challenge to know how to navigate these difficult times. We are praying God's strength and mercy over this whole situation, especially on those who are sick, unemployed and the front line folks who are caring for people around the clock.

Like you, our hopes and prayers are that this epidemic comes to an end soon. While we are faced with uncertainty over the next weeks we wanted to touch base with the PSC Community to let you know how we are adapting our program schedule in the midst of this crisis. The following changes have been made to the camp schedule:

Cancelled Events

All scheduled events for May have been cancelled, including retreats, Work Day, the Annual Scholarship Golf Outing and the Staff Homecoming Event.

Summer Camp

Because of the uncertainty of when we will be permitted to safely gather again we have decided to run a shortened version of our summer camp schedule. We will begin with Week 5-Long Week, on July 10. We are planning to run Camp Sessions Week 5-9 with a Family Camp Weekend on August 14-16. While we are cancelling Weeks 1-4, there are ample opportunities for any age camper to attend a later session. If you have already registered for camp during weeks 1-4 you should have received a separate letter with specific instructions and information.

Many of you have understandably held off from registering campers. We would like to offer you two incentives to register for camp now:

1. We are offering the Early Bird Discount of \$20 off to everyone that registers, no matter when you register this spring.

2. You will be given a full refund, less \$25, if we are forced to cancel the summer camp program entirely or if you change your mind about sending your child because of the COVID-19 fallout. (The \$25 fee goes toward online fees and processing, packet distribution and other office costs.) More details about how to receive a refund for this summer will be available May 1, 2020.

He received a *B.A.* from Grove City College (2001) in *Christian Thought* and a *Masters of Divinity* from Pittsburgh Theological Seminary (2004). He has served three congregations in two separate calls: Fairview Presbyterian and First Pres. of Newell, WV (2004-2009) and Center United Presbyterian Church in Midway, PA (2009-2020). He has served two Presbyteries (Upper Ohio Valley and Washington) on various



committees, including a term as Vice Moderator and then Moderator of Washington Presbytery. His wife's name is Wiebke (pronounced Veeb-ka). Brian and Wiebke have been married for 12 years. His daughter Renee is 21 and currently lives in Jacksonville, FL. Now the "children of the house" are their pets - a black Labrador named Talia and 3 cats: Mossy, Remy and Tenure. Pastor Brian loves both being outdoors with the natural beauty of God's Creation (including a goal to visit and explore many National Parks) and he enjoys reading of various genres. His favorite author is C.S. Lewis. Theologically, he is strongly rooted in the historical Reformed tradition. Support of both the local and global Church is close to his heart – he has visited Mexico, Scotland, Malawi and Kenya to encourage and minister with Christ's Church in those places. 


