## DR. BUD BRAINERD- SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR WALK

"God has poured out His love into our hearts...". No truer words were ever written. This short excerpt from Romans Chapter 5 can serve as a short and sweet reminder of some very important basics in life. Nine words tell us a great deal.

"God" is the subject of the sentence. He should be the subject of our attention, always. It is God who acts. It is God who initiates. It is God who has chosen to do something good in our lives. What God does in our life is determined by Him, not by us. If God's goodness toward us was dependent upon our deserving it, God would never be good to us. But He is. Always. Because of whom He is, not because of who we are.

God "has poured out His love". God can do anything. He has unlimited choices and unlimited resources. God chose to pour out, not withhold, not sprinkle, not ration, but "pour out" His love. The question is not whether we are half-full or half-empty. The question is whether we will be able to contain the fullness of God's love. God does not love a little. He loves a lot. God has not poured out indifference nor anger, He chose to pour out His love. And what was this love poured out into? "...into our hearts." Your heart, my heart, was the chosen target, the chosen receptacle, the chosen vessel to store God's love. Master Card has a series of ads asking "what's in your wallet?" The more important question is: "What's in your heart?" Christian, the answer is clear..."God has poured out His love into our hearts."

I don't know about you, but this truth reminds me of who God is, who I am, our relationship, and what I am capable of because of those realities. Why...I might even be capable of loving you!

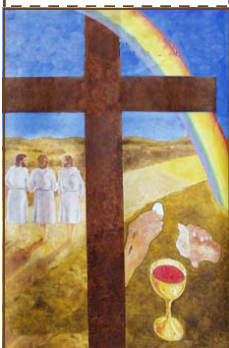

# the fourth day - sharing and testimony

Has it really been ten years since my walk to Emmaus, "CAEC #22, Table of Mary"? That weekend will be forever etched in my memory as I realized what countless meant when they said, "You will know when it's YOUR time to go." Exactly five months to the day earlier, my father, Dr. John Freeman, lost a five-year cancer battle, making his way Heavenward on Easter Sunday, 1997 (not a better day for new life!). His loss was the beginning of my closer walk with our Heavenly Father. Both lovers of God's beautiful creation, it was a natural transition of affection...except that God was so much more than I could have ever dreamed, in the role of Father and all else. That weekend also saw the untimely death of Princess Diana in Paris, followed by the loss of Mother Teresa a week later. I couldn't help but contemplate the treasure of each moment as I reflected upon the impact of both women in their God-ordained life circles.

As this decade has come and gone, my 4th Days have been an incredible adventure! Home from the Walk, I dug in with both hands (and a couple of feet, if stomping mud to make bricks during Marketplace AD counts!) to raise our two children while serving alongside Michael in the church God led us to within the connectional system. Our hearts were broken as they needed to be in order to minister to the multitude of needs that come with serving the Highland Gardens area of Montgomery. God-confident that, like Paul, our mission was complete after six years of growth inside and out, we set forth to return to Asbury Seminary as fortunate recipients of a 2003-2004 Beeson Pastor Fellowship. It was probably then that everything God had been building in us from the moment He joined us in ministry together became crystal clear.

The concept of creation and a heart for the lost have always stirred deeply within our souls as a ministry team. At Beeson, we were melted and molded into risk-taking pioneers (tall charge for two pleaser personalities!), committed to reaching out to the multitudes who have decided that they can live life "happily" without ever committing to Christ's precious Bride, the church. What a challenge for "lifetime churchmice" to realize that we were being called to a mission field within our own midst, with a language and culture so foreign to our own that there was no way to navigate these strange waters without God at the helm. Since our undeniable call to step away from every ministry and personal comfort structure in order to continue to plant WellSpring Community Church straddling Prattville/Millbrook, we have never known greater fulfillment nor greater joy. With that joy has come plenty of pain, plenty of nail-biting-turned-to-trust-eventually, and great soul-searching in seeking to please an Audience of One. Yet, God has creatively (if sometimes "down to the wire") provided every step of the way whatever has been lacking physically, emotionally, mentally, and spiritually.

Michael and I are living proof of Zechariah 4:6--"Not by might, nor by power, but by my Spirit' says the Lord Almighty." In my return to teaching, God has watered and fertilized the Garden Patch at Coosada Elementary as my first graders show me daily what our "first grade believers" must be experiencing as they "dig in" to "read" God for the first time! We are humbled by the prayers, encouragement, and financial support God has brought our way through His Kingdom-minded children. We pinch ourselves daily, ever cognizant of the fact that it is not often that you get the opportunity to be a part of something so God-dependent that every day is an absolute miracle. It is my prayer for each Pilgrim that your 4th Days lead you on a path of discovering the purpose for which He created you so that you will experience the joy of serving Him "no matter what." To God be the glory!

Do you remember in the Gospels the critical factor of narrowness that Jesus taught His disciples about? He said, "Strive to enter through the narrow gate" (Luke 13:24). ## THREE POSSIBLE CAUSES OF WEAKNESS IN GROUP REUNIONS

### Aimlessness

The group reunion card provides a format for meeting, order for spiritual discipline, and an agenda for sharing. But eventually members may need to clarify for themselves and, for one another, their expectations of the group reunion and their personal commitments to it. Otherwise, the sharing and sense of support levels off; the group stops meeting the deeper needs of members. The group can die from superficiality because of neglect and unwillingness to talk about dissatisfactions with the group reunion experience.

When a group first forms, it helps for the members to personally answer for one another:

- What do you want from this group reunion experience and weekly discipline? What do you hope will be gained?
- What is your commitment to God for which you need our support? Do you want to live in grace through the practice of piety, study, and action?
- What shall be our commitment to one another?

Agree as a group to stop every six months, or as need arises, to reassess the seriousness of the group about its reasons for meeting, the commitment of each person to live with spiritual discipline, and ways the group reunion can be more effective for each member.

Take seriously "Your Plan" for the next week. Take turns writing down each member's plans and asking them about their progress at the next meeting. Pray for one another to follow through on their plans.

### Alterations

Every group reunion experiences loss of members who move away, get married, get sick, or die, change groups, or simply drop out. A group in this situation should exercise its faith by turning its liabilities into spiritual assets. Realize Christ has called you to offer support for one another in these circumstances. For those who move away, send them off with God's blessing; maintain contact with them as members of your group through prayer and correspondence. When members are sick, meet as a group at their bedside. When members change groups, recognize their need without feeling rejected and pray that God will meet their need. When members drop out, keep them in prayer during group meetings and keep in touch with them as friends, continuing to uphold them in their faith.

### Anemia

Sometimes groups or individuals in a group suffer a diminishing of idealism, self-surrender, and charity for no apparent reason. This spiritual anemia may be experienced as spiritual dullness or dryness in individuals or in the group. This is sometimes the case even when group members are earnest about their spiritual 'disciplines' and their commitment to the group meeting. It is often the case, however, that when one member feels the group meeting is least worthwhile, another member feels it is most worthwhile. This underscores the importance of each one's commitment to participate regularly. We come to the meetings not only for ourselves, but to be there for the others and make the group meeting possible for one another.

"But blessed is the man who trusts in the LORD, whose confidence is in him. He will be like a tree planted by the water that sends out its roots by the stream. It does not fear when heat comes; its leaves are always green. It has no worries in a year of drought and never fails to bear fruit."
