We Change, He Doesn't

"God is not human, that he should lie, not a human, that he should change his mind. Does he speak and then not act? Does he promise and not fulfill." – Numbers 23:19

You have relationships and situations and obstacles and things that require the inside of you to match the outside. For you to walk in truth, you need to transform. What does that look like? Growth.

Growth requires change and change requires shifts in the way you think so that you can then make the needed changes in the way you live. This often includes some pretty difficult or demanding shifts in the way you believe, so that you can get shifts in the ways you behave. In other words, action often follows thought; your behaviors reflect your beliefs.

With the shifts we make in our believing and living, our hope is that the changes produce a positive effect—a deeper spiritual life, closer relationships, more health in our lives. There is a billion-dollar industry that is trying to help us do that: counselors, self-help gurus, books, and tons of digital content that's all trying to help us make these shifts so that we can get more healthy in our lives. Therapy can be awesome—I'm an advocate. But there's also stuff out there that's just not that helpful because it doesn't point us to Christ.

Question: who or what becomes your reference point to making the needed shift we all need to make? There's a plethora of reference points that you can turn to that will say, "Hey, let us help you change." Some are good, some aren't.

You want your reference point to be Christ so that you can get God's best wisdom and God's best results. We call those results blessings, and those are the results that we want. Our key reference point is our Creator made known in the person of Christ who reveals to His children the best way to live. This revelation comes from your choice to depend on His word and His Spirit that He has placed in you to guide you into all truth.


