By Laws Update; The board is collectively working on "maintenance" to our legal documents (Bylaws, declarations, covenants & restrictions) in 2022. Under advisement of Witschey Witschey & Firestine Co., LPA, we are aiming to address and correct multiple undefined or unclear statements within these documents. At this time, the board is not planning any material changes that haven't been addressed in previous amendments. After these documents have been refined, we will repost them to our website for all members to access. An outline of changes recommended by our attorney will be available at our Annual Meeting in April.

COVENANTS and RESTRICTIONS; As a reminder, before constructing any additions, pools, sheds, or structures such as gazebos, pergolas, fences, pool bars etc., detailed plans must be submitted to the HOA Board for review and approval. This is also a reminder that all RVs, boats, trailers, etc. are to be kept in your garages or located off site.

No Open Burning of Brush- City Code Reminders About Burning Brush, Firepits and Keeping Your Yard Looking Its Best! Just a friendly reminder to our neighbors about open burning per City of Green Code 660.08: "According to Section C: campfires and outdoor fireplace equipment, whether for cooking food for human consumption, recreation or similar purposes, is allowed as long as the fire is fueled with clean, seasoned firewood, natural gas or equivalent, and as long as the total fuel area is three feet or less in diameter or two feet or less in height and 25 feet away from any structure", which means bonfires and burning of brush is not allowed in our residential neighborhood. Our Mayfair Lakes Deeds & Restrictions Section 5.8 states, "No unsightly growth such as weeds, underbrush or the like, shall be permitted to grow or remain upon any lot and no refuse, pipe or unsightly objects shall be allowed to be placed or remain anywhere therein. Each owner shall keep all ditches and swales located in whole or in part on his lot mowed and free of trash, obstructions, weeds, bushes and the like." So, let us all do our part to maintain a lovely lawn and keep any weeds under control so we can remain one of the most desirable neighborhoods in The City of Green. Thanks everyone!

Mailboxes; I am sure you have noticed that there are several different styles of mailboxes throughout the subdivision. The board voted some time ago, to change the mailbox standard. The new rule is, we hope, simpler and easier to follow . Essentially, the new policy is that mailboxes should be white, brown, black, green, or beige in color, and that said mailboxes should not consist of novelty design, such as a motorcycle gas tank, a big mouth bass, a helicopter, etcetera.
