I. Japanese Feudalism

- 1. Stressed military ability
- 2. Fujiwara built huge military estates
- 3. Estates were self-sufficient
- 4. Heian period the gov't became decentralized
- 5. Feudalism was born 1185-1600

II. Japanese Society

- 1. **Emperor**: figurehead, continued to rule but no power
- 2. **Shogun:** Military general
- 3. **<u>Daimyo:</u>** Landowners, nobles, collected taxes, created armies, controlled peasants
- 4. **Samurai:** "those who serve", warriors on horseback
- 5. **Peasants:** Bound to land like serfs

III. Bushido

- 1. Samurai warrior code
- 2. Stressed self-discipline
- 3. Death over life
- 4. courage, obedience and loyalty to shogun and emperor.
- 5. Seppuku: Ritual suicide that allowed death with honor

IV. Similarities between Feudal Europe and Japan

- 1. Developed around the same time
- 2. Strict political structure
- 3. Strict social structure
- 4. Honor code: chivalry vs. Bushido
