1. Start with Wood Trends Double Bracket

- Available in 2" part # 5515xxx
- Available in 1 3/8" part # 5615xxx



Available in a variety
of colors in both 1 3/8" & 2"



2. Add Utility Rod

- 38" - 66" part # L704025
- 66" - 120" part # L706025



3. Note:

Treatments needing a center support will require the under-treatment to be pieced.

*Treatments over 48" wide typically require a center support.

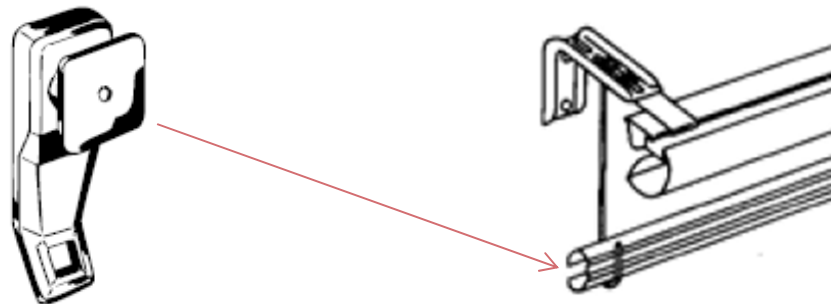


Using Pinch Pleat instead of Rod Pocket Under-treatment?

The aforementioned instructions work great for a Rod Pocketed under-treatment.

****For a Pinch Pleated under-treatment****

Add Celcon Traverse Slides (part # L909E025) to the opening along the back of the Utility Rod.

Kirsch, DH by Application

1. Start with Wood Trends Double bracket
2\" part # = 551300
1 3/8\" part # = 561300

2. Add Utility Rod
35\" - 66\" part # = L704025
66\" - 120\" part # = L705025

3. Note: treatments needing a center support will require the under-treatment to be placed
Treatments over 48\" wide typically require a center support

Using Pinch Pleat Instead of Rod Pocket Under-treatment!
The instructions above works great for a Rod Pocketed under-treatment.
For a Pinch Pleated under-treatment, simply add Collop Traverse Slides (part # L009E025) to the opening along the back of the Utility Rod.
