

CONFESSION and ABSOLUTION

1 John 3:1–3

P: In today's Epistle, John writes, "See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God." Yet, we do not live our lives as if we are children of God.

C: Father in heaven, forgive us for not always living in ways that honor Your name, which we bear as Your baptized children. You lavishly love us, but we have not shown love for You or for our neighbor. SERMON

P: Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness. Lord God, we desire to be right in Your eyes, and we thank You for Your forgiveness. Do not cast us aside, but satisfy us with Your salvation. Into Your hand I commit my spirit;

C: You have redeemed me, O Lord, faithful God.

P: Blessed are the merciful. Lord God, having been shown mercy by You, we are merciful to others. Work in us appreciation for Your mercy and grace. Into Your hand I commit my spirit;

C: You have redeemed me, O Lord, faithful God.

P: Blessed are the pure in heart. Lord God, continue to preserve us from having hearts that follow after anyone but You. Give us purity of heart so our eyes may be fixed on You alone. Into Your hand I commit my spirit;

P: Blessed are the peacemakers. Lord God, use us to be agents of peace in a world conflicted by sin as we bear witness to the Prince of

Peace. Especially bless the peacemaking efforts of those in civil authority. Into Your hand I commit my spirit;

P: Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake. Lord God, watch over us when we are persecuted for following You. Grant us and to all Christians steadfastness of faith. Into Your hand I commit my spirit;



C: Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.




THE LORD'S PRAYER
