# Colonial Acres Phase 5 Meeting Minutes December 12, 2018

Call to order at 6:01pm the regular membership meeting of Colonial Acres Phase V, Inc. at CAV clubhouse.

Conducted a roll call. The following persons were present: Bill Charles, Cindy Christiansen, Judy Keeling, John McGraw, Phillip Garlow and Jim Reuschlein.

Approval of minutes from last meeting. Approved – available in Newsletter.

Financial Report for prior month – Jim Reuschlein – 11months ending November 30, 2018. Motion to approve 1stJudy, 2ndCindy.

Judy discussed financial and wanted clarification on if expenses were lower this month. Financial report approved.

Management Report – Jim Reuschlein, Clearview Property Management

1A. Five units are listed for sale prices range from \$109,000 to \$125,000.

Carrying Charge increase of \$32.00 per month starting in January 2019. If members are currently on an ACH with Management company, we will update this information in our system. Ever increasing cost of asphalt, concrete and roofing work that needs to be done, the increase is necessary.

Vinyl project is still on going. Punch lists are being generated, caulking will take place in the spring. 9 buildings will be done this year 56-64. And 9 next year. 2019 buildings have not been determined. Downspouts and gutters are being done as well.

Bill also noted that work on asphalt and concrete that we are way behind on necessary repairs. More expensive every year to keep up.

Proposal for Aqua Weed company. This proposal has a zero increase for 2019.

Motion to approve \$4100.00 contract for Aqua weed. 1st JM 2nd CC Contract Approved.

Snow removal reminder to everyone. The longer the snow plows sit there waiting for cars to be moved the more it costs. Please move your cars in a timely manner.

Board acknowledges the snow removal company used an excessive amount of salt when applied a few weeks ago. Management will discuss with them to be more conscientious.

The board is aware of the inconvenience of having the dumpster in building 56 parking spaces. Members need to be aware that we have a very large ongoing vinyl project and the dumpster will have to remain in the community until the project is completed. Management will discuss with contractors the amount of debris that is associated with this project and ask them to tidy up surrounding areas. As we move project to the next area members parking spaces may be relocated to accommodate the dumpster.

Landscaping company is working in Phase 5 today for fall clean-up. The company has been behind schedule due to rain and snow. Thank you for all your patience in this matter.

The board at this time will be voting on our monthly meeting schedule change. The change will occur for all future meetings and will begin in 2019. Monthly meetings will be at 1pm. Howeverat the end of each quarter meetings will be held at 6pm. Schedule is as follows: Jan, Feb, April, May, July, October & Nov, meetings will be at 1 P.M. March, June, August & Sept (Annual) meetings are at 6pm. Please note there will NOT be a meeting held in December. At our August meeting members that are interested in running for open board positions will have the opportunity to introduce themselves to the membership before voting at the annual meeting the following month. Roof ridge vents are being installed as new roofs are being put on. The goal is to increase attic air flow reducing moisture.

57-5 Gloria Poirier please have trash by construction dumpster taken care of. Already addressed. 148-6 Janet Vandyke amount of salt being used by snow removal company is excessive and it needs to be cleaned up.

65-6 Bill Semion Will the city take over our streets, so we don't have to pay for asphalt? No city will not dedicate roads.

71-6 Bob Ciszewski question regarding meeting format.

65-6 Denise Semion wants to know how many members have not paid assessment and what is happening to those members that have not paid? That information is not public information. A handful of people have not paid, and those members are being handled individually.

#### Do Something New This Year

A few days before Christmas, Bill and I will fly to California to spend the holidays with our grand-children. While there, we will live in a different world, one where the waste stream is carefully sorted into compost, recyclables and trash. I end up asking lots of questions: does this go in the compost? How about paper? Is this plastic container trash or recycling?

Yes, their small community north of San Francisco provides several containers for the weekly pick up day: one for garbage, one for recycling and one for compost. Anything that once lived goes into compost, my daughter-in-law has explained to me several times. Yes, a tea bag is compost, and so is paper, along with table scraps and coffee grounds. Paper bags, not plastic, are used to collect the compost accumulated in the kitchen. Toilet paper rolls go to the compost. Once a year, residents can pick up free compost from the city once each year for the flowerbeds and gardens.

So when you think about what you put into your recycling bin or the trash, think again. How can you increase the recycling and decrease the trash put out at the curb? For one thing, the paper-board rolls from your paper towels and toilet paper are recyclable. Paper drink cartons, corrugated cardboard, paper bags, newspapers, greeting cards, magazines and brochures, a long with aluminum and metal cans, glass bottles and jars, and any bulky rigid plastic (like chairs, buckets and plant containers) can be recycled.

What is not allowed in your recycling bin? No plastic bags, foam containers (Styrofoam), wire hangers, window panes, mirrors, ceramics and Pyrex dishware, organic material and food waste, electronic waste (batteries, cell phones, etc.), paint, pesticides, oil and cleaners, waxed cardboard, needles or syringes or hazardous waste.

Many of us often forget that plastic grocery bags do NOT belong in the recycling bin, as they clog up the machinery at the recycling station. If you can make one change, just one change this year, please think about what you put and do not put into your recycling bin. 
