CLERGY COLUMN

Happy Lord's Day!

The topic for today is one that we are all very familiar with: Matrimony. This is the final Sacrament in our discussions and the second of two Sacraments of Service.

St. Paul gives us the best image of what marriage is meant to show to others, namely the love of Christ for his Church and vice versa. He writes about this in Ephesians chapter 5, which is a chapter some consider to be controversial if read on a surface level. We know the Church was instituted by Jesus and so she does everything in service to him, while Jesus literally dies for the life of the Church. He loves her to the end of his life, while she gives herself to his mission to the end of time. The union of the man and woman is meant to be a sign of this reality, which of course is a great challenge on the part of both the husband and the wife. I wonder whether all of our married couples were told of this great responsibility in their marriage preparation.

We all know the institution of marriage took place way back in the beginning when God made the man and the woman and told them to be fruitful and multiply. Thus a man shall leave his father and mother and he shall cling to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. This is the most foundational institution of the Bible and of humanity. In the Gospels, Jesus affirms the goodness of marriage on a number of occasions by quoting the Book of Genesis and by his presence at the Wedding of Cana. In fact, his very first public miracle took place at this marriage banquet at Cana (John 2:1-11). The Church has always understood this fact to be his way of elevating the natural order of marriage to the supernatural order of the Sacrament of Matrimony.

When a man and a woman enter into a valid marriage, the Lord supplies an invisible bond between them, "which by its very nature is perpetual and exclusive; furthermore, in a Christian marriage the spouses are strengthened and, as it were, consecrated for the duties and the dignity of their state by a special sacrament" (Code of Canon Law, 1134). The bond is established by God and can only be dissolved by the death of one of the spouses. "What God has joined, let not man put asunder."

Within the marriage itself, each person has his/her own special gifts within the People of God, which are meant to be used for the building up of the Church. The grace of this Sacrament is meant to perfect the couple's love and strengthen their bond of unity. By this grace they are able to help each other attain holiness in their married life and in welcoming and educating their children. Jesus takes their natural love and supernaturalizes it. Of course, anyone living in this world knows how necessary it is for anyone to have the grace of Jesus active in our lives if we are to attain "the holiness without which no one can see God" (Heb. 12). It seems like Jesus knew what he was doing when he applied grace to the most natural human institution. He's always looking out for us, creating ways to help us along the way to Heaven.
