

Christ is King! This feast day is rather new to our liturgical calendar. It was invented in 1925 by Pius XI because of the waves of Communism spreading across Europe, particularly in Italy. Originally it was celebrated on the last Sunday of October, but has since been moved to the last Sunday of the liturgical year. The point of this special feast day is to remind us that all of the world answers to God, no matter what the government looks like in the country where you live. All presidents and prime ministers, all

kings and rulers, all dictators, all legislators, all people must answer to Almighty God for the way they've lived their lives. This is the capstone of the liturgical year because it reminds us yet again, that the end of time is approaching, and we know neither the day nor the hour.

You will find in the bulletin an insert that shows the Mass times for the 4th Sunday of Advent, Christmas, and New Years' Day. The schedule is a bit hectic because two Holy Days of obligation (the 4th Sunday of Advent and Christmas) fall back to back. Still, it will be kind of fun to see you all at Mass on two days in a row, or twice in one day.



Thy Kingdom Come!

The kingdom of God, in the words of our Lord and Savior, does not come for all to see; nor shall they say: Behold, here it is, or behold, there it is, but the kingdom of God is within us (cf Luke 17:20-21), for the word of God is very near, in our mouth and in our heart (cf Deuteronomy 30:14). Thus it is clear that he who prays for the coming of God's kingdom prays rightly to have it within himself, that there it may grow and bear fruit and become perfect. For God reigns in each of his holy ones. Anyone who is holy obeys the spiritual laws of God, who dwells in him as in a well-ordered city. The Father is present in the perfect soul, and with him, Christ reigns, according to the words: We shall come to him and make our home with him (cf John 14:23). Thus the kingdom of God within us, as we continue to make progress, will reach its highest point when the Apostle's words are fulfilled, and Christ, having subjected all his enemies to himself, will hand over his kingdom to God the Father (cf 1 Corinthians 15:24), that God may be all in all (1 Corinthians 15:28). Therefore, let us pray unceasingly with that disposition of soul which the Word may make divine, saying to our Father who is in heaven: Hallowed by thy name; thy kingdom come (Matthew 6:10).

Note this too about the kingdom of God. It is not a sharing of justice with iniquity, nor a society of light with darkness, nor a meeting of Christ with <u>Beli-al</u> (cf 2 Corinthians 6:14-15). The kingdom of God cannot exist alongside the reign of sin.

"...whatever you did for one of the least of my brothers, you did for me" - MATTHEW 25:40

Most of us are generous when it's convenient for us. We are generous when we have the time or the money. But, generosity is the opposite of that. It means giving of one's time, money, compassion, forgiveness or mercy when it's not convenient; when it's not on our schedule, but on the other person's schedule.
