
December 6, 2016: The German Christmas Village in Philadelphia, \$35/person. Trip Full - Wait List Only.

Recently we were informed that our OC senior center used for our monthly AARP meetings and where many citizens frequent to enjoy cameraderie, pool, exercise, classes, cards, bingo and crafts, is under scrutiny for limited State funding. In an attempt to acquire state accreditation each of the four senior or MAC centers in our county must provide utilization numbers for this FUNDING PROCESS. This is accomplished by our signing in each time we attend a meeting here or use the facility for the treadmill, exercise room, planned outing, or AARP events. Currently some AARP members have cards and know to register with a telephone number in the machine to the right of the entry, however, many are unaware of this process. Many of our own members have not taken the time to register with the senior center so that we can support this process and save our center. Please take a moment today and fill out the form. It COSTS NOTHING, and means a great deal to the senior center and those who use it on a regular basis.

There are four senior centers in our County. If we lose our OC center, we lose our free meeting space and our community loses the many daily benefits of this center to our seniors.
