

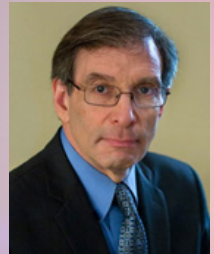

## MASS & SPREE KILLINGS:

**Exploring the correlation between Domestic Violence & Gender in Public Mass and Spree Killings**

Dr. James Alan Fox, of Northeastern University, will explore mass and spree killings where the complex dynamics of domestic violence are of central significance and appear to be the principal precipitant of the killings and those incidents where domestic violence forms just one aspect of the case, but may nevertheless be central to developing an understanding of the killings.



**Isla Vista Mass Murder Case Study**  
**Commander Kelly Moore (Retired) and Sergeant Joe Schmidt** of the Santa Barbara County Sheriff's Office will provide a case study of the murderous rampage embarked on by Elliot Rodger on May 23, 2014 that resulted in the investigation of six homicides, twenty attempted homicides, four officer involved shootings, and seventeen crime scenes.
