In today's Gospel, we hear the wonderful words spoken by the Angel Gabriel to Mary, "Hail, full of grace! The Lord is with you." Mary, learning that she is to be the Mother of Jesus, the Son of the Most High, is much perplexed by this message. However, she puts aside her uncertainties associated with the future, into which she is being invited, and gives her wholehearted consent, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be done to me according to your word." As we draw closer to the



birth of the Son of God into our midst, we can be thankful to Mary for her complete openness to God's will in her life and pray that we will have that same openness of spirit in responding to God's voice, realizing that we too are called to give birth to Christ in today's world amidst the circumstances of our daily lives.

CHRISTMAS SEASON: The Christmas Season celebrates the birth of the Lord Jesus and the ways he manifested the presence of God among us. "Next to the yearly celebration (at Easter) of the paschal mystery, the Church holds most sacred the memorial of Christ's birth and early manifestations. This is the purpose of the Christmas season" (General Norms for the Liturgical



Year, 32). In the Roman Catholic tradition, the Christmas Season begins with the first Mass of Christmas and concludes with the last Mass for the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.

DECEMBER 25 - SOLEMNITY OF THE NATIVITY OF THE LORD:

Today we begin the Christmas season which celebrates the birth of the Lord Jesus and the ways he manifested the presence of God among us. The word *Christmas* literally means *Christ's Mass or the Mass of Christ*. Historically, Christmas commemorates the birth of Jesus of Nazareth to Mary, a young maiden from Galilee. Theologically,



Christmas is the celebration of the Incarnation of God in Jesus the Christ – the self-revelation of God to the world in human form for the reconciliation of humanity to God. Liturgically, the Christmas season begins with "Mass During the Night" on Christmas Eve and ends on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord Jesus. **This day is a Holy Day of Obligation.**

<u>PECEMBER 26 - FEAST OF SAINT STEPHEN, THE FIRST MARTYR:</u> Stephen is the first-named among the seven deacons chosen to minister to Greek-speaking Christians in Jerusalem at the very dawn of the Christian Church. He is also the first recorded martyr of the New Testament.

DECEMBER 27 - FEAST OF SAINT JOHN, APOSTLE, EVANGELIST: Also known as John the Divine, the apostle John was the son of Zebedee and the brother of James. John was a fisherman, was very close to Jesus, and is the "beloved disciple" referred to in the Gospels. He was present at the Transfiguration, the raising of Jairus' daughter, and the Agony in the Garden. He is remembered for the fourth Gospel, the Book of Revelation, and the three Epistles which bear his name. John is believed to have died at Ephesus in extreme old age. In Christian iconography, his symbol is the eagle.

The 2023-24 Living with Christ Sunday Missal is available at the Parish Office for \$5.00 each. This missal helps Catholics prepare for and participate in the Sunday Eucharistic Liturgy. It is also useful for personal devotion. The Sunday Missal contains complete readings and Mass texts, as well as selected hymns for Sundays and feast days for the entire Church year.

DECEMBER 28 - FEAST OF THE HOLY INNOCENTS,

MARTYRS: This feast commemorates the 'Holy Infants', the male children recorded slain by King Herod in Saint Matthew's Gospel. This incident, along with the account of the flight into Egypt, presents the ancient tradition of the early Church: Jesus as the 'new Israel', persecuted and forced to flee, and the 'new Moses', marvellously rescued from the slaughter of the Hebrew children. This feast also points to Jesus as the Messiah and foreshadows the secular opposition which Jesus will later meet, culminating in his Passion.

DECEMBER 29 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT THOMAS BECKET, BISHOP, MARTYR: Born in London, England, about 1118, Thomas was ordained a deacon in 1154 and appointed Archbishop of Canterbury in 1162 by King Henry II. However, Thomas and the king did not agree on matters regarding the Church, forcing Thomas into exile in France. Within weeks of his return, he and the king clashed again. In a fit of rage the king wished aloud to be rid of this "low-born priest", and four of the king's men took this to be a command. As a result, Thomas was martyred in Canterbury Cathedral in 1170. Upon learning of the archbishop's fate, the king was shocked and all Europe with him. In 1173. Pope Alexander III declared Thomas a saint.

DECEMBER 31 - FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY AND JOSEPH: This feast, instituted in 1921, is observed on the first Sunday following Christmas, unless Christmas itself falls on a Sunday, in which case the Feast of the Holy Family is celebrated on December 30. Devotion to the Holy Family flourished during the Renaissance, and leading

artists of the time – Michelangelo, Raphael, El Greco, Rembrandt, Rubens, to name a few – often portrayed the Holy Family in their work.
