

#### Sunday of the Word of God

January 26, 2020

Recalling the importance placed on the Word of God at the Second Vatican Council, Pope Francis has established the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time as "The Sunday of the Word of God."

Heeding the call of Pope Francis and our Diocesan Bishop, you may notice a few changes in our liturgical practice here at OLV:

- Book of the Gospels: starting last Sunday, we are now reviving an ancient Christian liturgical tradition: a special book with the Gospel readings for Mass will be laid on the altar at the beginning of Mass. After the second reading, he who is to proclaim the Gospel will solemnly process with the Book from the altar to the ambo while "Alleluia" is being sung. Then he will proclaim the Gospel from the special book.
- **Lector Announcements**: since the lector will be processing in with the *Book of the Gospels* (in the absence of a deacon), the lector will no longer do the announcements at the beginning of Mass. The music ministry will initiate the worship experience. The priest celebrant will now do the announcements at the end of Mass.
- **Bulletins**: in an attempt to remove one possible distraction for us listening to the Word of God during Mass, the bulletins will now be distributed *after* Mass. Please take the bulletin home with you and stay connected with OLV by referring to it throughout the week.

Also, you may hear one of the readings from Sacred Scripture sung or chanted. When this happens, it is an opportunity to hear the sacred words in a new way.

Let us praise the Lord our God for revealing himself to us through Jesus his Son and in the many sacred writings that we embrace at every Mass!
