## SOFTBALL PLAYER PROFILE: BOB ZEIDLER -Larry Wolfe

California native Robert "Bob" Zeidler was born in San Diego and grew up in the San Bernadino area, graduating from Eisenhower High School in Rialto. As a nineteen-year-old, Bob decided to join the Air Force. He served for four years, first as a Flight Line Mechanic for B-52 bombers, then as a Telephony Specialist. He was lucky that most of his service was near home; he was first based at March AFB in Riverside, then after a brief tour in Guam, he was assigned to Norton AFB in San Bernadino. The skills he learned in the Air Force set the stage for a long career in the telecom industry.

Bob's first civilian job was as an installation and maintenance technician for Crescent City Telephone Company. After nearly three years, he relocated to the Seattle area, working for infrastructure contractor Henkels & McCoy. After another couple years it was back to California, where he worked for an

interconnect company in Sacramento. Due to the escalating cost of living in the Golden State, like many Californians, Bob decided to move to Arizona, landing a job with Communications Consulting, Inc. Four years later, he was hired by America West Airlines in their internal telecom support department. Bob spent several years with America West before being hired as a residential maintenance technician by US West (later merged with Qwest and then CenturyLink). He also worked on T1 and fiber optics networks in their commercial telecom division. Bob retired in 2021.

Softball has been a big part of Bob's life since the early 1980s. He's played on all types of teams over the years, including some very successful tournament teams. He joined our league in 2022 and has proven to be a solid-hitting, good-fielding outfielder with speed. He also played in the Chandler Competitive League for many years. He still subs for a team in that league but says everyone else on the team is "way younger," so it was time to graciously bow out!

The running family joke is that Bob met his wife Evelyn through an ad on Craigslist. In truth, he did hire Evelyn's housekeeping company that was listed on Craigslist and that's how they met.
