Mini Spare Tires

In order to save space, or in the case of 56 TBirds, to carry a spare in the trunk instead of fighting with the continental kit, some owners of 55 and 56 TBirds have gone to using temporal (mini) spares. It isn't as important issue with the 57's because of the way the spare fits in the trunk plus the trunk is physically larger, but it would work just as well.

Mini spares used are usually gotten from Lincolns, but Crown Victoria or Mercury Marquis spares may work as well.

These tires have limits, both for mileage and speed. Owners manuals spell out these limits. For instance, an 1988 Lincoln Mark VII manual states: "Warning-The temporal (mini) spare is provided only for temporary, emergency use. Do not use as a regular tire. Repair and replace the regular tire as soon as possible. Do not exceed 50 mph (80km/h) under any circumstances". There are more limitations stated, all in bold type. If you plan to use one of these tires, consult an owners manual for the model used so you know the precise limitations.

Since the mini spare is considerably smaller in circumference, it must rotate faster than the other tires. If the mini spare is on the rear, the spider gears in the differential will have to turn to make up for the difference in the two tire sizes. This will not cause any difficulty with a good rear filled with proper lubricant.

If the mini spare is used on the front, there will be a tendency for the car to pull to one side. After all, the front end wasn't aligned with the mini spare.

In either case, the mini spare will get you to a location where you can repair or replace your bad tire. Buy a serviceable used tire if you must, but get off that mini spare as soon as you can.

The last paragraph of the Lincoln manual states: "Any continuous road use of this tire or failure to follow any of the precautions may result in tire failure, loss of vehicle control and possible injury to vehicle occupants.

The mini spare is a good idea - just remember it is a temporary tire and use prudent judgment
