

improvements are being planned, including a new pavilion by the ball diamond with seating, restrooms, serving area, concession stand and storage. Also planned are electrical updates and new features at the park area on the south. The budget is \$300,000. Donations from recent fundraisers (Berries & Burgers, Lions Chicken Fry, etc.) have gone towards this goal. Other donations have been coming in for this project through the Strasburg Foundation.

A park fundraiser board has been created with donation envelopes from 1-200. You choose the envelope number and donate that amount. Once all donations are in, \$22,000 will be raised.

May Gnome Winner

Congratulations to Lela Ostermeier, winner of the Strasburg Community Action Network Gnome Giveaway for the month of May. Lela has lived in Strasburg almost all her life and commented, "I knew I never wanted to live anywhere else." Lela was married to Dwight Ostermeier for 68 years until his passing in 2015. She has a son Mark (wife Barb), two granddaughters, two great-grandsons and two great-great-grandsons.

At age 94, Lela remembers quite a bit about the "good old days" in Strasburg. She remembers Storm Hall, which was above Dick Storm's general merchandise and dry goods store. It later became Renshaw's store and was located on the south corner of Commercial and Rt. 32 where the Marathon station is now located. Storm Hall was used for high school class plays and high school graduations before the gym was built onto the Strasburg High School in 1942. The town merchants also sponsored free movies on Wednesday evenings and people would come to town to watch the shows.



Another memory was that of the Band Stand where the Strasburg Band used to play. This was located west of the Community Center around the area of the parking lot. On the corner (where Boldt Station is now) was the doctor's office and next to it (between the Band Stand and the doctor's office) was a little building called the Huddle. It was run by Wanda Mae Young and Betty Hood and they served refreshments, mostly to high school age kids.

Thank you, Lela, for your memories of Strasburg. Lela is thankful for the SCAN members and all they do for Strasburg. Lela has other gnomes around her home and was happy to receive another one. She has named him "Rudy".

Community Comes Together at Lions "LEO" Club Memorial Day Celebration, May 31, 2021

With a turnout of around 150 people, the Strasburg Lions LEO Club carried out a well-planned and memorable celebration of our veterans and fallen soldiers. LEO members, guided by advisor Jim Weiss, planned the celebration, designed and printed a program, arranged for the groups to participate, secured a speaker and raised money for the memorial wall by acquiring several sponsorships to honor the service and sacrifice of area men and women who have served in the military. \$3,170 was presented to the Veterans Memorial Committee, \$50 was donated to the Boy Scouts, who presented the colors; and \$100 each was given to the local American Legion Post and Auxiliary Unit.

The LEO Club received a grant from the Siemer Milling Endowment for Youth Leadership to help cover costs for the event. Besides the LEO members, also participating in the ceremony were the village, Boy Scouts, Strasburg and Windsor American Legion Posts and Strasburg American Legion Auxiliary Unit, community members and the Lions Club. Members of the Strasburg American Legion Post 289 and Windsor American Legion Post 725 combined for the rifle volley tribute before "Taps" by Lions Ian and Stephanie Kinkley.

Following the ceremony, the Lions Club served a lunch in the Community Building, with all veterans eating for free.


Henry C. Lading

"A marble monument stands in St. Paul's cemetery in the village of Strasburg, bearing an inscription that tells the silent but eloquent story of the heroic death of Henry C.

Lading, one of the first two men of Shelby County to meet a violent death in the war. Lading was a victim of the Hun's campaign of unrestricted submarine frightfulness, and with Jess Mars, another Shelby County man, lost his life in the torpedoing of the transport Moldavia, as he was crossing France with Company B, 58th Infantry, Fourth Division.

Lading, who was the son of Mr. & Mrs. Thomas Lading of Strasburg, and born Sept. 24, 1892, was called to the colors with the country's second contingent, leaving Shelbyville with 63 other men on the 18th of September 1917." Taken from: *Shelby County in the World War*, 1919, *Page 79*

Harold Lloyd Nippe August 02, 1923 - May 23, 2021

Harold L. Nippe 97 of Stockton, Ca. passed away Sunday, May 23, 2021. Harold was the son of Arthur and Goldie (Gill) Nippe and born at home in Strasburg, Illinois. After graduating high school, he worked on the Richland Township roads with his father Arthur, soon after he was inducted into the Army. Harold served in the U S Army 625th Engineers Light Equipment Co. during WWII in Glassglow, Scotland and Manilla, Luzon, Philippine Islands. He married Zelma Krile March 16, 1926, they had five daughters. Harold was a life-time member of the Strasburg American Legion Post 289 for 76 years and life-time member of the Effingham V.F.W. Post 1769.



Harold is proceeded in death by his parents Arthur William and Goldie Marie Nippe, his wife Zelma Lucile Nippe, daughters Patti Jo Nippe, Jo Ann Gennuso, sister Lula Bell, brothers Eugene and James. He is survived by his daughters Linda Lou Young (Charles), Joyce Quiroz, Donna Cox, brother Roger Nippe (Deloris) and 13 Grandchildren, 35 Great Grandchildren, 9 Great Grandchildren, many nephews and nieces.
