

SUMMER MUSIC SERIES THURSDAY, JULY 27th



The fare is only \$.50 for general public or \$.25 for mobility passengers. Transfers: \$0.10 and a monthly Pass is \$30.00.

Remember the bus drops and picks up in front of the center. Exact change required, Drivers are not permitted to make change. Remember to arrive ahead of scheduled depart times.
