2018 marks the 20th year of the re-excavation and conservation of the funerary temple/palace of Amenhotep III at Kom el-Hettan by the *Colossi of Memnon and Amenhotep III Temple Conservation Project*. For centuries the colossi have stood as sole witnesses to the largest, funerary temple in Egypt. Our study day celebrates the sun king and explores his temple's origins, splendour and its future.
