Rebates from East Hampton Town of up to 90 percent of the cost, or a maximum of \$3,000, for POET (Point of Entry Treatment) System Installation in Wainscott

Available to Wainscott property owners with wells where perfluorinated chemicals (PFCs) have been detected, in any amount, after water sampling and analysis. **The rebate program is intended to help affected homeowners** within the Health Department water testing area and proposed Wainscott Water Supply District **gain immediate access to clean water.** Once public water supply mains have been extended throughout the Wainscott Water Supply District and can be accessed for hook-ups, (expected to be completed by the close of 2018), the rebate program will cease.

What to Do:

Contract with a water filtration system supplier to have your system installed. Be sure that the system you choose is one designed to filter out PFCs.

How to Apply for Your Rebate:

You must live within the boundaries of the Wainscott Water Supply District (see map) or Health Department testing area. **After having your system installed** you will need to contact the town purchasing office at 631-324-4183 and:

- Fill out an application form (available on the town website at <http://ehamptonny.gov/602/Wainscott-Water-Supply-District>, the purchasing department or the supervisor's office) and:
 - Provide proof of property ownership
 - Provide proof of a water test that detects perfluorinated chemicals
 - Provide a signed and notarized affidavit by your water treatment system installer that the system has been installed at your address (Affidavit to be signed will be provided by the town, through the website or purchasing office)
 - Provide a copy of an invoice marked "Paid"
 - Complete a W-9 form for the town's records

What if I installed a water treatment system prior to the announcement of the rebates?

If you installed a water treatment system in response to the discovery of PFCs in Wainscott well water – following test results showing contamination in your well -- you are eligible for the rebate.

What if I have a system already but it doesn't treat for PFCs?

Upgrades to or replacement of water treatment systems that don't treat for PFCs, so that they do filter out the chemicals, will be eligible for a rebate.
