

Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Only in this way can the parish issue documents attesting to parish membership and Catholic practice, e.g. a letter to be a Godparent or Sponsor. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

Parish Council: Meets on the Monday evening after the third Sunday of the month.

Holy Name Society: Meets on the Monday evening after the second Sunday of the month. President, Anthony Martelli

THE EMPTY TOMB

That the Devil is strong is an understatement! Whoever says otherwise does so at his/her own peril. Take the events of Holy Week for example, when the room of the Last Supper was pervaded with doom and gloom.



Move on to the Garden of Olives, where Jesus agonized for hours and pleaded with the Father to let the cup pass Him by. Then recall the painful betrayal by Judas, the false accusations from the High Priest and his Cohorts, the flogging, the bleeding, the torturous journey to Calvary, the crucifixion, the taunting, and finally the death. Think of the mood, as Jesus' loved ones brought Him down from the

Cross. In all these was the overshadowing sense of hopelessness among Jesus' family and friends.

They gave up and scattered everywhere, ready to return to life before Jesus came into their lives. That's the power of the Evil One. But when power meets power, the stronger power carries the day. The one that laughs last laughs most. The Devil is a loser! A sore one at that! So, Jesus returned, in His glory! He's risen! Alleluia!

There are times in our lives when we stare at the empty/sealed tombs. Life seems to be over. No door seems to open up! We cry out with Jesus: Father, why have You forsaken me? You, your loved one, or someone you know may be staring at an empty tomb at this time. Tell yourself, and tell them that yes the Devil is powerful, but the power of our Risen Savior is way beyond that of the Devil. In the midst of our fears and anxieties, the Risen Savior whispers, "It is I, do not be afraid."



May the Risen Lord bring hope and joy into your life and the lives of your loved ones during this Easter Season. Amen. Alleluia.


