Show and Tell

The challenge for October was member's choice on what to turn, you just needed to use one of the tips from September's club meeting.

We only had one member, John Stewart, who met the challenge and talked about the tip he used, and several other members brought some projects to share with the club.

<u>Demo</u>

Bob Robinson was the presenter for the night showing another way to make a Christmas ornament. He started with a paper roll tube, and cut it to about two inches. Then after some fancy math he laid out some veneer with decorative strips so they would be evenly spaced around the tube. Then he glued the veneer to the tube. Once glued, he attached the tube to the lathe using jam chucks on both sides. This allowed him to sand the veneer smooth, and finish it. This completed the center section.

Next step would be to turn a top and bottom. You will need a lip on one end of the top, and a lip on one end of the bottom to allow you to glue them to the tube. You will also drill a hole through the center of both. Now use you creativity for the top and bottom design, then sand and finish. You are now ready to glue the top and bottom to the tube. This really makes an attractive ornament.
