HOPE Scholarship:

- Requires 3.0 GPA from high school
- Must maintain a 3.0 cumulative college GPA to retain scholarship
 - Covers a portion of tuition as outlined by individual institutions

Zell Miller Scholarship:

- Requires 3.7 GPA from high school AND an ACT Composite score of 26 or SAT score of 1200
- All Valedictorians and Salutatorians who meet the minimum HOPE requirements also qualify
- Must maintain a 3.3 cumulative college GPA to retain scholarship
 - Covers the full amount of tuition

Formulaic Admission

Considers limited factors, such as:

- GPA
- Minimum course requirements
- Class rank
- Test scores

Standards for admission or scholarships are often posted on their website. More clear to applicants whether or not they will be admitted.

Panther Predictor

Students who wish to enter Georgia State University directly from high school will be admitted based upon the following four factors: SAT/ACT composite score, high school grade-point average, freshman index (FI), and number of high school courses completed in the core subject areas. The FI is based on a combination of SAT/ACT scores and high school grade-point average in college preparatory courses only.

This tool will help you determine the probability of freshman admission in advance of applying. The system will calculate your data and report an "unofficial admission decision" for first time freshmen only.

This tool uses the SAT two-digit test scoring structure (10-40) adopted in March 2016. If your test date was before March 2016, you will need to convert your scores to the new scoring structure. The **College Board concordance** provides conversion charts and other resources to see how your old scores compare to the new scores.

Note: International students should refer to the international admissions page for more information.

The SAT FI formula is: SAT FI= (500x HSGPA) + SAT V + SAT M


The ACT FI formula is: ACT FI= (500 x HSGPA) + (ACT composite x 42) + 88

Please note: admission requirements may vary from year to year, and the requirements mentioned here are the minimum values and do not guarantee an admission to Georgia State or a scholarship.







Holistic Admission

Considers factors, such as:

- Grades & courses
- Extracurricular activities
- Essays
- Interviews
- Test scores (if required)
- Recommendations

Typically used when there are more qualified applicants than admission spots. Admission is more gray.



College Trajectory...

- 9th grade
 - Adjust to high school
 - Get involved
 - Study
- 11th grade
 - College Fairs & college visits
 - SAT/ACT in Spring/Summer
 - Introduce yourself to your counselor
 - Get to know a teacher for recs
 - Study

- 10th grade
 - Study
 - PSAT/Pre-ACT
 - Stay involved
 - 12th grade
 - College essays over summer
 - Apply to college
 - Final Testing
 - Study



Application Plans & Considerations

- Early Action ("EA")
 - Non-binding deadline w/ earlier admission decision
 - Typically apply to as many colleges as wanted EA
- Early Decision ("ED")
 - Binding deadline w/ earlier admission decision
 - If admitted, must withdraw all other applications and enroll
 - Can apply to only one school ED
- Regular Decision
 - Typically final deadline in winter/spring
 - Can apply to as many colleges as wanted
- Rolling Admission
 - Admission decision is rendered within a set timeframe from when you apply
 - Open until class is filled

May 1: National Decision Day



Financial Aid



- FASFA: Free Application for Federal Student Aid
 - Stafford Ioan, Pell Grant, Work Study, etc.
 - Required by all colleges who award federal funding
- CSS Profile
 - Institutional aid
 - Not required by all colleges
- GSFAPPS: Georgia Student Finance Application
 - HOPE & Zell Miller Scholarships
- Institutional application



When to apply for financial aid...

- FASFA and CSS Profile applications open October 1st
- Deadlines can vary from school to school
- Apply the year prior entering college
 - The sooner the better...
- Submit a new application every year that you would like to receive financial aid
