Although the official legislative sessions are currently closed, activity is bustling. People are currently campaigning for your vote. As pillars of the healthcare community, it is important to ask yourself, do I know where their positions stand and how does that affect me, my family, and my career?

Messaging and TV ads can be confusing and often times misleading. It is important to separate propaganda from

fact. You can do that by going to <a href="http://legis.wisconsin.gov">http://legis.wisconsin.gov</a>. Here, you can directly view what bills your senator and assembly representatives have authored, supported, or chosen to take no action. There are opportunities to attend a listening session, ask your questions, and get direct answers. This not only helps you

validate the positions in which leaders take on current issues, but also provides educational opportunities for our leaders to learn from those directly in the field of nursing.

Go the extra step to prepare for the vote. Take a look at what the ballot will look like before you head to the polls at <a href="https://www.myvote.wi.gov">www.myvote.wi.gov</a>.

Polls will be open August 9, 2016 for a partisan primary and November 8, 2016 for general election. Wisconsinites can vote during the polls open hours of 0700 hours to 2000 hours.

WALPN urges you to take action, educating your local legislators about LPN's. It is paramount that we are able to educate them about our licensure, accountability, certifications, and our professional associations that strive to create a voice for LPNs and ultimately for our patients. LPNs continue to be the heart of nursing, we hope you join us for every beat.

# **Capnotes Educational Corner**

Summer Allergies Symptoms and Treatments

- 1. Runny nose
- 2. Watery or itchy eyes
- 3. Sneezing
- 4. Coughing
- 5. Dark circles under your eyes

### Over the Counter Treatments

- 1. Antihistamines
- 2. Decongestants
- 3. Nasal Spray Decongestants
- 4. Eye Drops
- 5. Nasal irrigation

### **Prescription Treatments**

- 1. Corticosteroid nasal spray
- 2. Leukotriene receptor antagonist
- 3. Ipratropium bromide nasal spray (Atrovent)
- 4. Immunotherapy (you'll get tiny forms of shots, tablets or drops of allergens)

### Treatment for Insect or bug bites

- 1. Severe allergy: Epinephrine shot (always carry two) & call 911 after the shot is given
- 2. Mild reaction: Ice to bite areas
- 3. Tylenol or Ibuprofen for pain
- 4. Hydrocortisone or Calamine lotion to help itching
- 5. Antihistamine

### How to Make Allergy Season Easier

- 1. Stay inside when pollen and smog levels are high
- 2. Keep your doors and windows closed and run air conditioning to keep allergens out (use air purifier)
- Clean air filters in home often, also clean book shelves, vents and others places where pollen collect
- 4. Wash bedding and rugs in HOT water to get rid of dust mites and others allergens
- 5. Wash your hair, shower and change clothes after you have been outside
- 6. Vacuum often and wear mask, use HEPA filter
- 7. Wear mask when you mow the lawn to avoid grass pollen
- 8. Keep humidity in your house between 30%-50%, dust mites won't thrive
