## WORKING THRU A PROBLEM AND SHARING THE RESULTS By Dave Peterson

After a couple days with special friends and good mechanics trying to resolve my coupe problems. If driven above 30 MPH the car would stumble, cough and backfire. The group consensus was, distributor, fuel, carb, manifold leak, and electrical.

We rebuilt the distributor and two carbs, replaced the manifolds gasket, replaced the plugs, and fuel filter and more.

Finally, I found this in Les Andrews troubleshooting book.

"At idle speeds only about 4,000 volts is needed to ionize the air-fuel mixture in the cylinder and permit the high voltage charge to jump the spark plug gap. However, at high speed, the internal electrical resistance is much higher, so much higher at the spark plug is necessary. Otherwise, ignition can be erratic, with misses and loss of power."

I have expected a coil to fail when hot - otherwise if works it is good. WRONG!

After blowing the muffler with many excessive backfires we replaced the coil, and the coupe is like new.

It is only a hobby!!

# **Working Smart**

Member Phil Zins is not one to sit idle, his garage is his playground and he never seems to run out of ideas and innovative ways to work on his projects. As he is progressing on the restoration of his coupe he is now on to the body work. Phil has created a lift / rotisserie of his own design to begin work on this stage of his project.

The first two pictures show its use in the usual way, to rotate the body to do sandblasting, painting and body work. The second set shows it's use for lifting the body off the frame.

Note that the Rotisserie has two sets of screw jacks. One set raises/lowers the body relative to the pivot point to get the body at about the center of gravity. The second set of screw jacks raise of lower the body relative to the ground to make it easier to work on.
