FLAG SALUTE: Mayor P. Yetter led the Flag Salute at 7:07 PM

ROLL CALL: Committeeman D. Coranoto, Committeeman T. Dooley, Committeeman D. Hansen, Committeeman K. Gourlay, and Mayor P. Yetter. **Also Present:** Township Administrator E. Klose and Township Attorney S. Roseman.

APPROVAL OF THE CONSENT AGENDA

Committeeman D. Coranoto requested that Correspondence #4 be removed from the Consent Agenda for further consideration.

Committeeman D. Coranoto and Committeeman D. Hansen requested that Correspondence #5 be removed from the Consent Agenda for further consideration.

Committeeman T. Dooley requested that Correspondence #2 be removed from the Consent Agenda for further consideration.

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Committeeman D. Hansen, with all members in favor, to approve the Consent Agenda as listed, with the items referenced above removed for further consideration.

Correspondence #2 - Gruer, Colabella & Liuzza – Re: Municipal Court Public Defender: Committeeman T. Dooley referred to a letter from Daniel P. Agatino, Esq., from the Law Firm of Gruber, Colabella & Liuzza, to Joint Municipal Court Administrator Maria Spiegler requesting that the Court consider appointing him to serve as an alternate public defender in situations where a conflict of interest might exist. Township Attorney S. Roseman stated that this type of request should be discussed at the Joint Municipal Court Committee Meeting. Township Administrator E. Klose added that the Governor's Office gives final approval regarding public defender appointees.

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman T. Dooley, with all members in favor, to table this matter until the Joint Municipal Court has had an opportunity to review Mr. Daniel P. Agatino's request.

Correspondence #4 - NJ League of Municipalities – Re: League Supports A-2681 and Opposes A-2405/S-1651 Concerning the State of Limitations on Civil Actions for Sexual Abuse: Committeeman D. Coranoto made a distinction between bill A-2681 and A2405/S-1651 relating to the statute of limitations for civil actions for child sexual abuse cases. A-2681 would extend the current statute of limitations from 2 years to 7 years, however, A-2405/S-1651 places no statute of limitations on such cases. The New Jersey League of Municipalities does not support the latter because of the financial burden it would place on local governments defending claims that could be decades old. However, the League does support the 5-year extension provided for in A-2681.

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman D. Coranoto and seconded by Committeeman D. Hansen, with all members in favor, to adopt a Resolution supporting bill A-2681 and opposing A-2405/S-1651.

Correspondence #5 - NJ League of Municipalities – Re: Update on Affordable Trust Funds: Committeeman D. Coranoto referred to a Notice from the New Jersey League of Municipalities (NJLM) regarding the State's attempt to seize trust fund dollars from local government offices that have not yet committed their affordable housing funds to a project. Committeeman D. Coranoto added that the NJLM is seeking relief from the Court by way of an injunction prohibiting the State from seizing the funds. Township Administrator E. Klose confirmed that she wrote a letter to the Office on Affordable Housing on behalf of the Township Committee stating the township's commitment to embark on an affordable housing project with SCARC within the next 2 years.

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman K. Gourlay, with all members in favor, to accept Correspondence #5 as listed on the Consent Agenda.

ORDINANCES

The Township Committee reviewed a list of township properties that could potentially be sold at a public land sale. Township Administrator E. Klose suggested removing Block 901, Lot 2602 because it is a sizable lot that is contiguous to State land. Therefore, the State might be interested in purchasing the parcel. The Township Committee agreed by full consensus to remove Block 901, Lot 2602 from the list of properties to be sold at Hampton Township's Municipal Land Sale.


**HAMPTON RESOLUTION: APPROVAL TO SUBMIT A GRANT APPLICATION AND



NEW BUSINESS

NJ MOTOR VEHICLE COMMISSION – BLUE LIGHT PERMIT APPLICATION FOR NICOLE L. GUSTA

A MOTION was made by Committeeman K. Gourlay and seconded by Committeeman D. Coranoto, with all members in favor, to approve a Blue Light Permit for Hampton Township Fire & Rescue Member Nicole L. Gusta.

CALENDAR YEAR 2012/2013 BEST PRACTICES INVENTORY – APPROVAL FOR SUBMISSION TO THE DIVISION OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICES

A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Coranoto and Mayor P. Yetter, with all members in favor, to authorize the submission of Hampton Township's Best Practices Inventory to the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION – RE: SUSSEX COUNTY WASTEWATER SERVICE AREA MAP

Township Administrator E. Klose noted that the NJDEP recently reviewed the preliminary future Sussex County Sewer Service Map and accepted Hampton Township's request to include Kittatinny Regional High School and the McKeown Elementary School in the sewer service area. Providing the Township Committee does not have any additional comments regarding the maps, Sussex County Planning Director E. Snyder would like to forward the final version to the State. The Township Committee agreed by full consensus that the final version of the map was satisfactory.

HAMPTON TOWNSHIP ROTARY CLUB – 50/50 OFF-PREMISE RAFFLE LICENSE #2012-1040 TO BE HELD ON DECEMBER 18, 2012

A MOTION was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Committeeman K. Gourlay, with all members in favor, to approve a 50/50 Off- Premise Raffle License for the Hampton Township Rotary Club as listed above.

COUNTY OF SUSSEX – UPDATE FROM CHIEF ENGINEER BILL KOPPENAAL REGARDING CR 519 AND CR 626 TRAFFIC SIGNAL

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that county officials ordered parts to repair the timing mechanism on the traffic light located at the corner of County Route 626 (Halsey Road) and Route 519. The light will be fixed within the next ten days.

REVALUATION – REQUEST FOR EXTENSION FOR REVALUATION FOR THE 2012 TAX YEAR

Township Attorney S. Roseman stated that it took the State six weeks to approve the contract for Hampton Township's upcoming Revaluation, causing the project to be delayed. Township Tax Assessor J. Ferraris requested that the Township Committee consider postponing the Revaluation until FY 2014. Township Attorney S. Roseman stated that the contract includes a provision that

allows Hampton Township to change the date without it affecting the original bid amount of \$195,000.

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Committeeman D. Coranoto, with all members in favor, to approve a request from Township Tax Assessor J. Ferraris to extend the Revaluation Project in Hampton Township from FY 2012 to FY 2014.

HAMPTON TOWNSHIP EDUCATION FOUNDATION – ON PREMISE 50/50 RAFFLE LICENSE #2012-1041 TO BE HELD OCTOBER 13, 2012 AT HAMPTON TOWNSHIP RECREATION PARK

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman D. Coranoto and seconded by Mayor P. Yetter, with all members in favor, to approve an On-Premise 50/50 Raffle for the Hampton Township Educational Foundation as list above.

HOLIDAY BANNERS – LIGHT POLE BANNER PROJECT ESTIMATES

Township Administrator E. Klose displayed two banner samples for the holiday display that is planned for the township's commercial district from November to January.

Township CFO J. Caruso had confirmed that the township has the funds to purchase 20 banners. Township Administrator E. Klose suggested that the township purchase the initial banners for the shopping district and seek sponsorships from local businesses for future purchases. Businesses that sponsor a banner would have their names listed on it. Committeeman D. Coranoto stated that he has already spoken with several business owners who expressed an interest in a sponsorship.

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Committeeman K. Gourlay, with all members in favor, to authorize an application and application fees in the amount of \$175 to the NJDOT for permits associated with the display of twenty holiday banners for the Hampton Township Commercial District and to authorize the purchase of twenty holiday banners at a cost of \$200 each.

AGREEMENT TO ACCEPT AN EASEMENT FROM PROPERTY THE OWNERS OF BLOCK, LOT AND TO APPROVE THE REMOVAL OF EXISTING PIPE, AND INSTALL A NEW DRAINAGE PIPE

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Committeeman D. Hansen, with all members in favor, to authorize an Agreement between the property owners of Block 1001, Lot 14 and the Township of Hampton to approve an easement in order to remove an existing drainage pipe and install a new pipe.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS COUNCIL 9920 – ON-PREMISE RAFFLE TO BE HELD JANUARY 8, 2013 AT OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL CHURCH

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman D. Coranoto and seconded by Mayor P. Yetter, with all members in favor, to approve an On-Premise Raffle for Knights of Columbus Council 9920 as listed above.

REQUEST TO HIRE FRANK BENNETT FULL TIME AS A LABORER AT THE AN HOURLY RATE OF \$15.50 EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2012

Mayor P. Yetter stated that Seasonal DPW Employee Frank Bennett has been doing a terrific job over the past several months working on maintaining the grounds within the Hampton Township Municipal Complex.

A MOTION was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Committeeman K. Gourlay, with all members in favor, to authorize hiring Mr. Frank Bennett as a fulltime Township DPW Employee at an hourly rate of \$15.50 effective October 1, 2012.

DISCUSSION

Committeeman D. Coranoto gave an update regarding the status of certain matters that are pending in the State Legislature. He reported that the franchise tax issue is still pending, there has been progress concerning the energy tax, COAH issues are still pending in Courts, bill A-323 concerning "special occasion events" on preserved farmland is still pending, and Governor C. Christie is supporting bill A-2760 concerning requirements for BPU to establish statewide reliability standards for electric and gas utilities.

Township Committeeman D. Hansen stated that the Hampton Township Fire & Rescue, Inc. is holding a Tricky Tray on November 9, 2012 at the Baleville Congregational Church. Anyone who is interested in making a donation should contact Township Tax Collector Leah Korver.

Committeeman K. Gourlay requested an update regarding the overgrown brush and weeds located at the corner of the access road leading to Lowe's Home Improvement Center and Route 206 S. Mayor P. Yetter stated that Lowes removed all the weeds.

Committeeman T. Dooley raised the issue of forming a Bridge Committee in conjunction with officials from Kittatinny Regional High School (KRHS) and Stillwater Township. KRHS Administrator C. Hutcheson made a suggestion several months ago to create a Bridge Committee in order to provide a venue for local officials to discuss community topics that affect both the schools and the municipalities in the district. Mr. Hutcheson informed Township Committeeman T. Dooley that Stillwater Township is the only municipality in the school district, other than Hampton Township, that expressed an interest in participating. Regardless, Mr. Hutcheson indicated he would like to move forward with the Bridge Committee.

Township Administrator E. Klose gave an update regarding the "Welcome to Hampton Township" signs that will be constructed by students who attend the Sussex County Technical High School (SCTHS). SCTHS Instructor H. Drake contacted E. Klose to inform her that the computers at the high school had crashed. As a result, the details associated with the sign project were lost. He agreed to pick up a copy of the chosen design from Administrator E. Klose next week at her office. Shortly thereafter Mr. Drake will provide township officials with an estimate for constructing eight signs.

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that Naetone Tuxedos on Route 94 closed several months ago. The Township Planning Board granted permission to the owners temporary use of the facility to sell remaining equipment and inventory. The owners are currently using the location as a thrift store.

Township officials discussed whether this type of use was permitted without the need to apply to the Township Planning Board for approval. Although the facility is still being used for retail purposes, it is a different type of retail from what previously existed. Township Administrator E. Klose contacted Township Planning Board Attorney B. Morgensten to obtain an opinion as to whether Planning Board approval is necessary in this situation. He responded that Hampton Township Code 85-2 states that site plan provisions requires Planning Board approval.

Township Administrator E. Klose suggested that township officials consider amending Township Code 85-2 for the purposes of clarifying the definition of the terms "use" and "type" within the Code.

Committeeman D. Hansen stated that certain factors to be considered when reviewing a new zoning permit includes parking requirements, compatibility with existing businesses, and peak hours of operation.

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Committeeman K. Gourlay, with all members in favor, for the Hampton Township Planning Board to review and interpret Hampton Township Code 85-2 pertaining to Site Plans.

Township Committeeman D. Coranoto expressed concern about JCP&L's willingness to honor an old quote to install electrical wiring for the Mike Biron's Field of Dreams Project in the Municipal Park. Township Attorney S. Roseman stated that normally JCP&L charges a service fee after wires are installed regardless of whether there is power running through the lines. Therefore, it is better to delay the installation of wiring until the township is ready to start using it.

Committeeman T. Dooley stated that the plan is to construct the utility shed this year that will house the power supply. He explained that the project coordinators are considering making a request to JCP&L to either reduce their rate or perhaps waive fees altogether until the power is turned on.

PUBLIC SESSION

Township resident Ms. Michelle Ryan was present to represent the Crandon Lakes Association of Property Owners (CLAP) regarding snowplow reimbursements. Ms. Ryan made an inquiry about the formula used by township officials to determine the amount private communities receive each year for snow removal reimbursements.

Mayor P. Yetter suggested that CLAP representatives contact the municipal office and make an appointment to speak with Township Administrator E. Klose, who will go over the formula in detail. Township Administrator E. Klose offered to meet with CLAP representatives at their convenience, including Saturday or one evening during the week. Ms. Ryan stated that she would relay that information to the Association members. If a meeting is scheduled, Committeeman D. Hansen suggested that Township DPW Manager D. Bayles attend.

Township resident and Boy Scout Bryce Cutler was present and explained that he was attending the meeting as part of his efforts to achieve an Eagle Scout Badge. He intends to write a persuasive article on an issue discussed at the meeting that has two opposing viewpoints.


