Sunday, January 20th

NFC Champ: Green Bay at San Francisco. 6:40pm ET on FOX
1★ SAN FRANCISCO (-7.5) 27 Green Bay 18. These two met here back in Week 12 where San Francisco dominated the Packers 37-8 (-3.5). The 49ers had a 339-198 yard edge and remarkably held Aaron Rodgers to 3.2 yards per pass (2nd lowest of his career) and the Packers were 0-for-13 on third down in that game. Green Bay is 9-1 in games decided by 8 points or less this season. Their 63-point scoring differential was the lowest for a 13-win team in the Super Bowl era. That screams that Green Bay is overrated. The Packers have been outgained on the season (-9 ypg) and were outgained last week in their win over Seattle. Green Bay nearly blew an 18-point lead but a couple of big 3rd Down throws by Aaron Rodgers proved to be the difference. WR Davante Adams did have a GB playoff-record 160 receiving yards. On the other side, San Francisco was dominant at home this year outscoring their opponents by 13 ppg (best in the NFL) and outgaining them by 114 ypg. Last week, the 49ers dominated the Vikings with 21-7 first down and 308-147 yard edges including 186-21 on the ground. San Francisco got back 3 defensive starters in Dee Ford, Kwon Alexander and Jaquiski Tarrt. The 49ers defense looked more like the unit that allowed just 11 ppg in the first 7 games of the season (No. 1 in the NFL), not the one that allowed 26 ppg in the final 9 games (No. 24). The 49ers didn't allow Minnesota to gain a first down for more than 27 minutes of game action starting late in the second quarter. Certainly the bye week looked like it helped them. While Green Bay has the edge at QB, we feel the 49ers are clearly the better team at most of the other positions and we feel Kyle Shanahan is the far superior coach to Matt LaFleur. We usually don't like laying the "hook" but that's what we're recommending here.

AFC Champ: Tennessee at Kansas City. 3:05pm ET on CBS

1★ KANSAS CITY (-7.5) 29 Tennessee 20. These two met in the playoffs two years ago with Tennessee (+8) overcoming a 21-3 halftime deficit by winning 22-21. The Titans also won the earlier meeting this season 35-32 (+4) rallying in the final seconds. KC had about a 95% win probability as they were up 5 with the ball with under 2 minutes left but a blocked FG catapulted Tennessee to their game-winning TD drive. Tennessee has now won and covered 4 straight over KC. Last week history was made for both teams. First, Tennessee RB Derrick Henry became the 1st player in NFL history with at least 180 rush yards in 3 straight games. The Titans (+10) won despite being outgained 530-300 (-230). That's the worst yardage differential in a win in NFL postseason history. Tennessee was +3 in TO's and also stopped Baltimore on 4th down four times including twice on 4&1. It was the biggest playoff upset in 9 years and was Baltimore's first loss as a double-digit favorite in franchise history. Baltimore had been 38-0 SU including the playoffs. On the other side, the Chiefs were the first team in NFL postseason history to win a game by 20 or more points after trailing by 20 or more points. They remarkably closed the game on a 51-7 run after trailing by 24 to start the game. The Chiefs have not lost since that Titans game going 7-0 SU (+16.9 ppg) and 7-0 ATS (+9.5 ppg) with an average score of 31-14! The last 5 times a team has played 4 straight road games they are 0-5 SU (-14.2 ppg) and 1-4 ATS (-9.5 ppg). We certainly have not been right on Tennessee the last two weeks and while it's tough to jump in front of a hot team, the Chiefs are even hotter and we feel KC is the best team in the NFL with the best QB, the 2nd best head coach and a much improved defense compared to past editions. We also lean UNDER as it is the highest total of the season in a Tennessee game and obviously the public is overreacting to the 82 points scored last week between KC and Houston.
