Paul Farfaglia Selected to fill Board Vacancy

At its meeting on October 7, 2019, the Executive Board selected Paul Farfaglia to fill the Director position created by the untimely death of Sylvia Matousek. According to the By-Laws, if any office (other than President) "becomes vacant, it shall be filled by a vote of the Executive Board until the next election is held by the General Membership." The next election will be held in May, at which time he will have to seek re-election.



Paul has been an active NYSUT member, serving as President, Vice-President, Treasurer and Delegate for his local, Jordan-Elbridge TA. He also served as the ED 7 – 8 At-Large Director on the NYSUT Board of Directors and served ten years as a Trustee of the NYS Teachers' Retirement System. The Executive Board of RC 7 agreed that his past service and multitude of experiences make him a valuable asset to our organization. *Welcome to RC 7, Paul!*

Have You Sent in Your Participation Fee?

Active membership in Retiree Council 7 is open to every NYSUT retiree of any NYSUT represented group in Election District 7. ED 7 is comprised of all units in Cayuga and Onondaga counties. One important note: If you are retired from Auburn, ESM, Jordan-Elbridge, Liverpool, North Syracuse, or Port Byron, your RC 7 participation fee is collected with the dues for your local retiree chapter and then forwarded to us. You should not use the form here or mail dues directly to us.

Participation fees are accepted at any time. However, to be able to nominate your child or grandchild for one of our June 2020 scholarships you must pay your participation fee by Dec. 31, 2019.
