### Reformation Sunday—October 31st

Reformation Day, anniversary of the day Martin Luther is said to have posted his Ninety-five Theses on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany (October 31, 1517), later identified by Protestants as the beginning of the Reformation.

### **Reformation Sunday**

Presbyterians celebrate the tradition that grounds their faith on Reformation Sunday. It is always the last Sunday in October, marking the occasion in 1517 when Martin Luther posted his 95 theses on the church door in Wittenberg, Germany.

### 1. Reformation Sunday gives us a chance to tell our story – a chance to remember.

We all have a family story – how we got to this point in history. Reformation Sunday is a day when we remember and re-tell the family stories of our faith. Stories about men and women who came before us and taught us about the faith. Stories about people who risked everything so that we would be able to gather and worship in the manner that we do.

### 2. Reformation Sunday reminds us of the most important things.

Throughout the year we preach and learn about many things in church. About how we live our daily lives, the choices we make, the habits of our faith. On Reformation Sunday we are brought back to the most important thing – the thing that compelled Luther and others to risk their lives.

On Reformation Sunday, we return to the core of our faith: **God loved us first, and God continues to shower us with grace and mercy.** 

### 3. Reformation Sunday challenges us to do better

Through re-telling our story and returning to the core of our faith, Reformation Sunday prods us to do better.

We are called to be more loving and grace-filled, because God was gracious and merciful to us. We are called to repent of the times that we have placed barriers that have kept others from hearing the Good News. We are called to remember that all that we are is a gift from God.

In the church in Wittenberg where Martin Luther preached, there is a wonderful painting. In it Luther stands in the pulpit on the right hand side, and the people stand on the left. In between people and the preacher is Christ on the cross. Reformation Sunday is a reminder that this is the bedrock of our faith – the grace and mercy given to us in Jesus Christ. Keeping the most important thing in the center of the picture is the only hope for our faith and for this community that we call "church."




# WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY OCTOBER 6, 2024

"All who eat and drink without discerning the body, eat and drink judgment against themselves." (I Cor. 11:29)

The first Sunday in October is designated as World Communion Sunday, which celebrates our oneness in Christ with all our brothers and sisters around the world. Paul tells us that we are to "discern the body" when we partake of Holy Communion, mindful that we note our relationship to all our brothers and sisters in Christ in the celebration. One is not to go hungry while another is drunk! (I Cor. I I:21). This is scandalous behavior opposed to the Way of Christ. Thus it is appropriate that World Communion Sunday is also a time when we receive the annual Peace and Global Witness Offering as a way of continuing the ancient Christian practice of sharing what we have with brothers and sisters in need.



### What is World Food Day?

World Food Day is celebrated to bring awareness to the issues surrounding world hunger.

### Theme: Right to foods for a better life and a better future

After the Great Depression, the United States was desperate to better the standard of living for its citizens. Families were struggling, hunger and malnutrition were extremely high and those who worked in the agricultural field were dying to make up for the overproduction they worked with for many years.




On Oct. 16, 1945, 42 countries gathered in Quebec, Canada to try and combat the problems of hunger and malnutrition around the world. Their efforts formed to create the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO). The FAO's overall goal is "to achieve food security for all and make sure that people have regular access to enough high-quality food to lead active, healthy lives."

Hunger and food insecurity is when a person lacks the accessibility to safe and nutritious food for normal growth and development, who then suffers from physical discomfort and possibly death. The World Counts, a site dedicated to tracking issues regarding the global population, states that global issues such as hunger and malnutrition account for about 3.1 million child deaths a year, or 30 percent of child deaths overall.

Not only does this day celebrate the founding of the FAO, but also the work the FAO has done to help millions of people around the world. These celebrations bring attention to other worldwide issues that tie into our agricultural habits and growing population.

In the process of combating world hunger, the FAO has fostered the improvement of digital technologies such as irrigation systems, autonomous climate control and autonomous tractors to make farming more efficient. Technological advancements allow farmers to produce more food locally, as well as export goods at higher and faster rates.



### Let the Children Come



**Theme:** Jesus loves and welcomes all the children.

Object: None

Scripture: Mark 10:2-16

How did you get to church this morning? (Pause for responses.)

I imagine most of you came with your parents. Perhaps others came with grandparents. Some children may have come with aunts, cousins, or an older brother. Maybe a Sunday school teacher or friend brought you to church. One thing I'm pretty sure of is that unless you live close enough to walk to church, someone had to bring you here. I don't think

any of you are old enough to drive your own car, are you? (Pause.) I didn't think so!

It's great that someone cared enough about you to bring you to church today. That tells me the person wanted to make sure you would learn about Jesus and His love for you.

The Bible tells us about a time Jesus was teaching his disciples, and a large crowd of other people were following Him to hear what He was saying.

As Jesus was teaching, people started to bring their children to Him so He could touch them. The disciples didn't like these children interrupting Jesus. They told the people to get the children away.

What do you think about the disciples trying to make the children leave?

Jesus was very upset. "Let the children come to me, and do not stop them," Jesus said. "The kingdom of heaven belongs to these little ones." Then Jesus took the children in His arms and blessed them (Mark 10:2-16).

Let's always remember how Jesus loved the children and took them into His loving arms. We're thankful for each of you here today and thankful someone loved you enough to bring you.


