# Details & Other Activities

## Seneca Nation Cultural Speaker

*With a proud and rich history, the Seneca were the largest of six Native American nations which comprised the Iroquois Confederacy, a democratic government that pre-dates the US Constitution. Known as the "Keeper of the Western Door," the Seneca are the westernmost of the Six Nations. At the time of the formation of the Iroquois League, the original five nations of the Iroquois League occupied large areas of land in the Northeast USA and Southeast Canada. Representatives from the Seneca nation will be speaking and sharing their stories.*

## Underground Railroad Tour

*Between the American Revolution in 1776 and the end of the Civil War in 1865, thousands of freedom seekers escaped slavery in the United States. Many relied on a network of people and places known as the Underground Railroad. Neither a railroad nor underground, this network helped freedom seekers reach safe haven in Canada, where slavery was abolished and no person could be claimed as property.*
