On March 5, 2016, 650 students from the Kansas City Region met at the Harry S Truman Museum and Library to compete and defend their research products on historical topics of their choice in the 2016 National History Day Regional Competition . Liberty North's gifted students represented well, placing in each of the 4 categories in which they competed. Braydee Chu placed 1st in the Historical Website category out of 103 regional submissions with her research on "Sacred Music in Medieval Europe: The Birth of Polyphony and the Rediscovery of Notation". Levi Anderson placed 2nd in the Historical Paper Category out of 43 regional submissions with his paper titled, "A New Strategy: British General Edmund Allenby's Capture of Jerusalem During World War I". Olivia Carlile and Elizabeth Potterf placed 2nd in Historical Group Performance category with their performance of "The Stonewall Riots: A Crack in the Wall". In the Individual Documentary Category, because of the significant number of entries, final rounds were held to determine the top 3 places. Liberty North students Ashleigh Erickson, Christina MacKenzie, Ingrid Weaver, and Katie Mosely advanced as 4 of the 6 finalists, which was ultimately won by Katie Moseley, who placed 3rd in Individual Documentary with her research titled "Mathew Brady: Photographer of a Nation." Their teacher is Kimberly Brownlee. The winners advance to the State National History Day competition held on April 30 at the University of Missouri campus in Columbia, Mo. The top 2 winners in each category at State will represent Missouri at the National History Day competition in Washington, D.C. In June.
