As was announced at the January meeting, a difficult decision was made by the Quilt Show Committee to table the plans for a show this year.

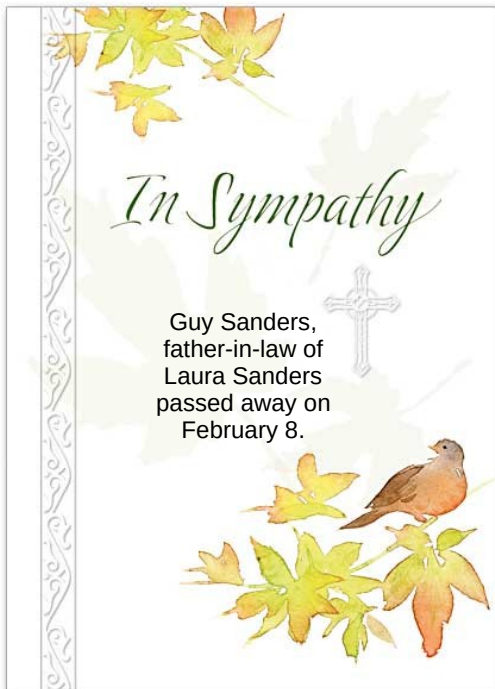

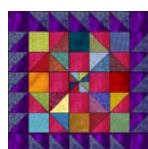
