



MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF

As many of you have your yards on your mind during this long wet cold spring, I would like the opportunity to talk a little about wildland fire season. As you clean up your yards this spring, you should think about creating a 5-foot clearance of noncombustible materials around your house including woodpiles, sheds and landscaping. This wet spring has the potential to increase the fire danger as the heavy brush being created now quickly turns into fire fuel when the summer heats up.

Big Lake Fire has been working diligently to increase our brush fire capabilities. We have been the recipient of two surplused brush trucks that we have been getting ready with grant monies from the Department of Natural Resources (DNR). Our crews have also been doing increased training, side by side with DNR crews. As our

climate changes, we are also seeing more need to be able to interface with local agencies and neighboring departments for brush/wildland fires.

The Helitac crew is scheduled to be in place in our station around the middle of June. They are on duty 7 days a week, 12 hours a day with a crew of roughly 7. These crews are away from home and away from their families for long periods of time so please stop in and shake their hand and give them a big thank you.


2022 FIREWORKS SHOW
