

## Copper Ridge Uniform Dress Code 2018-2019

Copper Ridge School has a Uniform Dress Policy for kindergarten through eighth grade students. The Uniform Policy gives the school a positive and distinctive identity, and reflects the values of the school and community. Students are required to conform to the Uniform Policy each day.

### Acceptable Uniform Clothing Items:

*All acceptable clothing items must be plain and solid in color and may not have logos or decorations.*

1. Collared shirts, either short-sleeved or long-sleeved  
*Acceptable colors: white, navy blue, light blue, black*
2. Shorts, skorts, dresses, and skirts - must be approximately knee length  
*Acceptable colors: navy blue, tan (khaki), black*
3. Pants and Capris  
*Acceptable colors: navy blue, tan (khaki), black*
4. Jackets in uniform colors  
*Acceptable colors: white, navy blue, light blue, black*
5. Close-toed shoes are highly recommended for safety reasons.
6. Hats/caps may be worn outside only and are not permitted indoors.
7. Students participating in Copper Ridge School athletics or Principal-approved organizations may be allowed to wear their uniform/t-shirt/jersey on the day of the event as long as other uniform dress code requirements are met.
8. On Fridays, students may wear jeans with a Copper Ridge logo shirt OR a uniform shirt. Administration also has discretion to allow Spirit Days or 'dress-down' days.  
*NOTE: All non-uniform events must be approved by the Principal ahead of time.*

### Unacceptable Clothing Items:

1. Clothing and jackets with decorations, including items such as logos, stripes, and sequins
2. Leggings, yoga pants, or tights worn without a uniform-appropriate dress or skirt
3. Casual sweat pants or jogger pants
4. Jeans or jean-like (stretchy knit), even those in uniform colors
5. Any clothing item that does not meet Copper Ridge uniform color requirements
6. Any cover-up (long-sleeve shirt, jacket, etc.) worn in lieu of a uniform shirt
7. Logoed clothing worn inside out

### Uniform Dress Code Enforcement and Consequences

Parents will be notified of uniform dress code violations by a dress code form, email, or phone call.

The following may occur if a student is out of uniform dress code:

1. The student may request clothing be brought from home or be provided with alternative clothing from the nurse's office.
2. The student may receive school consequences or loss of privileges. Behavior intervention may include a daily check-in with administration.
3. For habitual or recurring violations, the student may receive an SUSD Code of Conduct Disciplinary Referral and appropriate consequences, including an in-school or out of school suspension.
