It is a great privilege and thing of joy to update you all on the intended purchase of the field (4.33 acres) and 4 lots of 80X120 each. After consultations with the different committees in the parish, it was decided to buy the landed property for the expansion of the school and parish. The field will be good for the kids as regards sports activities and the 4 lots for future use of family functions. At the moment, 15 families have donated or pledged to the purchase of the landed property. \$47,200 in pledges and \$32,600 in cash, bringing everything to \$79,800. I am really grateful to these families for their generosity and your parish family thanks you so much.


HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS
