Note: These are guidelines for your use. If you choose to make a quilt larger than 60" x 60", that is fine, just be aware that the price will be \$85.00. Items under 900 sq inches should be boutique donations.

Raffle Quilt 2026 Block Y Instructions

- 1.) Open kit and separate precuts, become familiar with precut numbers and paper piece pattern. The numbers pinned to fabric will match the numbers on the paper pattern. The colors of the fabric are marked by "b" for blue and "c" for cream.
- 2.) Be sure to start with a sharp new needle and update the stitch size to "very small or smallest" at 1 or 2 on your machine dial.
- 3.) Place **b1** on back of paper piece sheet with wrong side down, use flashlight to make sure b1 fabric square covers all area of b1 paper square.
 - a. Note: the back of the sheet will be the front of your block when completed. You will be sewing on the printed lines on the "front of the sheet" but this will become the back of the block.
- 4.) Place **c1** with right sides together on **b1** square, pin **c1** to **b1**. **SEW with 1/4" seam** on horizontal line between **b1** and **c1** squares on printed pattern side. Begin sewing just before the line and just after line.
- 5.) Cut thread and separate from sewing machine.
- 6.) Fold sheet back online between **b1 & c1 (**the line just sewn) to prepare to cut 1/4" seam from the blocks sewn together.
- 7.) Use ruler to measure $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam and cut.
- 8.) Bring paper to ironing board; warm the fabric and press the cream-colored fabric over, finger press. Then dry press the two squares down. Find **b2** fabric in precuts pile.
- 9.) Open sheet of paper; following the numbers on the pattern; add **b2** to the NOW FRONT of the paper piece sheet. ((The pattern with the printed lines is now THE BACK of the block)) your finished block will be on the "original back" of the paper piece pattern.
- 10.) Add b2 fabric precut with right sides together over the two squares b1, c1 being sure to line the sides of the b1,c1 and c2 together. (This is the line you will sew over) Once the precuts are lined up together, pin b2 to the paper.
- 11.) Turn pattern over and **SEW with ¼" seam** on the line between b1/c1 and b2. Begin a little before and end a little after the line begins/ends
- 12.) Cut all threads down (4 pieces) and remove from sewing machine.
- 13.) Fold fabric back on line between b1/c1 and c2 place on cutting board and use ruler to cut 1/4" seam
- 14.) Bring paper to ironing board; warm the fabric and press the newly sewn fabric over, finger press open. Then dry press the two squares open. Find **c3** fabric in precuts pile.

- 15.) Unfold paper pattern and place **c3** precut **over b1/c1** according to paper piece pattern. Be sure to line up fabric on line between b1/c1 and c3, use a flashlight if you need to or place against window/lightbox. Once lined up, pin into place. (this will be on the current FRONT of the block)
- 16.) **SEW with 1/4" seam** on the "back of the sheet" with the printed line, between the b1/ c1 and c3 fabric. Begin sewing a little before and a little after the line.
- 17.) **Remove pin and cut all threads -** remove pattern from sewing machine.
- 18.) Fold paper pattern back over line between b1/c1 and c_3 . Place on cutting board and use ruler to cut $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam.
- 19.) Bring paper to ironing board; warm the fabric and press the cream-colored fabric over, finger press. Then dry press the two squares down. Find **c4** fabric in precuts pile.
- 20.) Line up c4 pre cut with **b1/c2/b3** along line between **c4** and those three previously sewn pieces of fabric.

Continue paper piecing in this way until pattern is complete. Repeat steps 10 – 20 following numbers on pattern, sewing on lines between new and old fabric precuts, cutting $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam and ironing open until entire block is complete.

Please go back in your email and find the **Angela Walters paper piecing tutorial sent on March 11 at 8:17pm.** This will help you have a better idea of paper piecing.

Your kit includes:

• 6 pages of paper piecing pattern:

REMEMBER: the printed "front" of the pattern will actually become THE BACK of the pattern once you begin working.

The plain white empty back of the sheet will become the **"FRONT OF**

- THE BLOCK" as you construct your block.
 - Pre-cut fabric as follows:
 - B = BLUE C = CREAM
 - All fabric precuts are 2 inches wide
 - B1/c1 fabric = TWELVE 2" squares in
 - B2 = SIX 3" rectangles
 - \circ C₃ = SIX 3" rectangles
 - \circ C4 = SIX 4" rectangles
 - \circ B5 = SIX 4" rectangles
 - \circ C6 = SIX 5" rectangles
 - \circ B7 = SIX 5" rectangles
 - B8 = SIX 6" rectangles
 - C9 = SIX 6" rectangles
 - B10 = SIX 7" rectangles

Please note: We will be making size Large, using Option 2 for the border. Please refer to your pattern for more info.

Project Bags 2.0 pattern - Patterns by Annie - PBA206-2 Main fabric* - Fat quarter Lining fabric* - Fat quarter Coordinating fabric - $\frac{1}{3}$ yard ByAnnie's Soft and Stable* - 15" x 15" Fusible interfacing (Pellon Shapeflex/SF101 is preferred) - $\frac{1}{3}$ yard Vinyl for front window of bag - 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Handbag zipper (size 4.5 is preferred) - one 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ " or longer single-slide zipper Thread to match fabrics (50wt polyester thread is recommended)

* Main fabric, Lining fabric, and Soft and Stable should be quilted, cut, and sealed as per pattern steps I-A, B, and C, BEFORE CLASS.

Sewing machine in good working order, with a new 90/14 topstitch needle Rotary cutter and cutting mat Quilters' rulers Scissors and thread snips Wonder Clips Removable marking tool, such as Sewline Tailor's Click Iron and ironing board

Nonstick/Teflon presser foot (can also cover regular foot with painter's tape) ByAnnie's Stiletto and Pressing Tool 12mm (½") bias tape maker



Gina Krejsa called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

December Board Minutes: Kerry Cogen made a motion to approve the December minutes, AI Accettola seconded the motion. Approved unanimously, nine (9) board members were present at time of approval vote.

Old Business:

Board/Committee Status:

- President: Gina Krejsa
 - Confirmed everyone saw the current calendar and no changes are required.
 - County Complex has approved our meeting dates for 2024.
 - Gina will update members on the google drive at the next meeting.
 - Request for circulation chair and nomination committee members being accepted.
 - Everyone looks at their sections of the website, letting Gina know if there are major corrections.

• Treasurer: Kerry Cogan - Treasurer Report

- The end of year treasurer's report was presented.Had incoming revenues from program and membership. Outgoing from Program, storage and holiday party. Several expenses on the raffle quilt including insurance, raffle tickets being printed and photos of the quilt.

- Spending was less than budgeted and programming bought in money.

- We will transfer the balance from the raffle account before starting to generate income from the 2024 raffle and leave a balance equal to the budgeted amount in the account.

- Review financials from 2022 (show year) to 2023 (no show year) to provide transparency to the guild and the board, understand where we spend and make our money.

- Finance operates on a 2 year cycle with most money coming in during the show year with the exception of 2020 when we did not have the show.

- Budget is broken down into Operating expenses and Fundraising expenses (provide a profit to the guild). Rent is historically one of the

biggest Operating expenses but with the use of the county center this will go away. In 2023, workshops are the biggest fundraising expense as they are priced to cover the cost not to generate money.

- Total operating and fundraising was a net loss for 2023 (non show year).

- In 2022 operating cost was higher because of the rent and membership fee was less. The fundraising profit was much higher because of the show.

- Total operating and fundraising resulted in a net profit.

- From a financial standpoint the Show enables the guild to operate with a healthy financial budget.

- Putting on the show takes about 700 hours over the 3 days, so we need members to volunteer for multiple shifts during the show.

- Fundraising doesn't just support the guild it also allows us to donate to our chosen charity.

- Membership over the past 5 years has remained relatively static at a headcount of approximately 80. Membership aging demographic needs to be considered as we choose where we spend our time.

- We will present this information in the February meeting




