I taught political science at the State University of New York at Brockport for forty-one years. During this time I encountered more than 10,000 students, some of whom have gone on to become federal judges, prominent attorneys and businesspersons, and professors. Paul Giglio is one of the five most outstanding students whom I have encountered.
