SOW PEACE WHERE YOU GO

A couple of weeks ago we heard the story of the multiplication of the loaves and fish. Jesus transformed a meager amount of food



to a meal that satisfied thousands. Today we hear Him tell the disciples that "the harvest is abundant" (Luke 10:2). As God provided abundant milk and overflowing prosperity to Jerusalem in Isaiah, Jesus provided abundant food and now an abundant harvest to the people. So too does God's grace continue to overflow into our world. Jesus is not only the Bread of Life, satisfying our hunger with His own

Body and Blood, He is our redeemer, abundantly sharing forgiveness through humankind. Our harvest of spiritual sustenance and redemption is indeed plentiful.

Consider this episode form the Gospel a dress rehearsal. Jesus sent out seventy-two disciples, a number thought to be the total number of nations on earth, to bring peace, cure the sick, and proclaim the kingdom. After His resurrection, Jesus called upon the disciples to be His witnesses to the ends of the earth, making disciples of every nation. The disciples were able to do it then because they had rehearsed it now. Today we are the ones who are called to the mission, to the harvest, to bring peace, comfort, understanding, and forgiveness to people around the world.

As in last week's Gospel, Jesus specifically tells His disciples not to retaliate. Last Sunday He rebuked James and John when they asked to call down fire from heaven to destroy the Samaritan village that refused to welcome Him. Today He tells the disciples to

move on if they are rejected. He instructs them to offer peace wherever they go. Unlike money, which He specifically told them not to bring, the peace the disciples did bring could be given again and again, and when it was not received it returned to them. Peace, not discord, is what we should sow so that at harvest time we can return rejoicing.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

When God Speaks Like a Polish Grandmother

A friend of mine had a Polish grandmother who was famous for giving her children some blunt advice every time they left the house: "Eyes straight ahead. Mind your own business."

Every mother knows her children best, and this mother knew hers liked to argue and sometimes liked to show off. She knew that could lead to trouble. She could not anticipate every scenario they would encounter each time they departed from her. All she could do was distill what she knew about life, safety, and manners into a few simple words, and hand them over to her children like a set of car keys or a hastily scribbled map. In this way, a woman who rarely said "I love you" expressed her devotion. And long after she was dead and buried, her aging sons and daughters repeated these words to themselves, like a child wrapping himself in a warm blanket.

Jesus does much the same for us, in many portions of the Gospels. "Ask the master to send out laborers for his harvest...Carry no money...Eat what is set before you...Know that the Kingdom of God is at hand...Rejoice because your names are written in Heaven."

He knows us best — knows our strengths, but even more importantly, he knows our weaknesses. He doesn't always have the space to address each of these explicitly in the pages of Scripture, but what he can do is distill the truth of effective evangelization into a few simple words, and hand them over to us as food for our journey of discipleship. In this way, a God who addresses the entire world and every soul who ever lived also speaks intimately to each one of us.— *Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS*
