Willingness to Follow Directions

- Stop whatever you are doing and listen to the directions you are given.
- Listen carefully, you may think you already know what they want but may be a detail that you didn't know about.
- Take notes if possible.
- Something is not “stupid” just because you don't understand it.
- If you don't understand the directions, ask rather than guess.

Willingness to Learn

- You do not know everything.
- Your employer does not expect you to know everything at first.
- Do not pretend to know something. If you don't know say that you don't know.
- Look for opportunities to get more training.
- Knowledge adds value.
- The more you know the more valuable you are to your employer.

Initiative

- Do things that you see that need done without being told to do them shows initiative.

Willingness to Take Responsibility

- Show a willingness to accept an obligation and be held accountable for the results.

Loyalty

- Be positive.
- Look for solutions to problems.

- Work to build a positive reputation at work.
