

'Be compassionate as your Father is compassionate'

The gospel today contains the most challenging of all the Christian commandments and probably the most difficult to keep: love your enemies and do good to those who hurt you.

In last week's gospel, through the Beatitudes, the disciples learned that to be a faithful follower of Jesus, they must be committed to a new order at variance with ways of the world. This week's text tells them how they must live in that new order; in a sense, it provides the practical details. What Jesus is suggesting should not be confused with passivity or simply inaction or resignation in the face of persecution and injustice. Quite the contrary! What Jesus is suggesting is radical action. It demands that we act towards others without being asked, that believers offer friendship and pardon constantly, without asking or hoping for anything in return. In Jesus is located God's self-revelation, God's actions in and for the world, a plan for salvation and its fulfilment. Followers of Jesus must act in these ways precisely because they are the ways of God – and God, as we are told, is Love which of its nature is open to see the potential good in others because they have discovered it in themselves and to act out of the goodness within oneself. Jesus goes on to elaborate: turn the other cheek; love your enemies. Do not retaliate as this serves to endorse wrong doing. Do good to those who hate you! Be agents of healing not retributive hurt. This may well seem an impossible ideal as a way of life - a huge challenge beyond the Beatitudes.

The first disciples of Jesus may well have made this judgement, had it not been for the memory of the life Jesus had lived in their midst. In the New Testament, these first followers shared how they came to recognise the central importance of the New Commandment of love, as they reflected on the selfless life of Jesus and its culmination in His tragic death. In Jesus' words through John the evangelist, "no greater love can there be than to lay down one's life for one's friends" (Jn 25:12-13). Clearly the Law of Love – proclaimed today, is an ideal that none of us may ever fully realise particularly on occasions when our survival or wellbeing is threatened by another and instinct can urge retaliation in us. But being Christian is about striving towards the ideal - not to retaliate in kind and to spread suffering but to model how we should behave towards each other as incited by our God Who Is the ground of all Being – who is Love. So how can we love others as Christ Himself has loved them in our daily interactions? It's about compassion even for the most misguided. "Be compassionate as your Father is compassionate". Jesus is teaching us not to set limits to the practical goodwill we bear towards our fellow human beings. The way of true happiness lies in celebrating and sharing the gifts of God's Spirit that we have received through our faith in Christ Jesus and for this laid down His own life.

The Mystic Theologian Howard Thurman (1899 -1981) said:

"You don't need anything to bring you to God... When I love people, then I find God in me ...and in them."

God, Ground of all being,
open our minds and our hearts
to recognise your Presence and Love
within and for All.
Amen



Stations of the Cross – after 9:10am Mass in the Church



The jubilee calls for us to think about setting out on a journey and to cross boundaries. When we travel, we not only change places physically, we also undergo a personal change. It is important to prepare ourselves well to plan the route and learn about our destination. The word pilgrimage comes from the Latin "per ager" meaning "across the fields" or from "per eger" meaning border crossing".

In the Bible, Abraham undertakes a long journey, obeying God's words "Go forth from your land, your relatives and from your father's house" (Genesis 12:1). He ends up in the Promised Land where he is remembered as a "wandering Aramean" (Deuteronomy 26:5). Jesus' ministry can also be seen as a journey from Galilee to the Holy City of Jerusalem. "As the time drew near when Jesus would be taken up to heaven, he made up his mind and set out on his way to Jerusalem." (Luke 9:51). Christ calls his disciples to walk this road and even today, Christians are those who follow him and set out after Him.
